3. Tax Incentives for Regional Businesses

Hon Robin Scott: To move on the next day of sitting —

That as an incentive for West Australians to start and operate businesses in the Mining and Pastoral Region, the Agricultural Region and the South West Region, this House calls upon the Government of Western Australia to —

- (a) halve payroll taxes from 5.5% to 2.25% for businesses with less than 100 employees 100km from Perth; and
- (b) eliminate payroll tax for businesses with less than 100 employees 1,000km from Perth.

4. Sale of the Western Australian TAB

Motion No. 1 having been called, Hon Colin Holt continued his introductory remarks in moving the motion as follows —

That this House calls on the McGowan government to immediately 'test the market' for the sale of the WA TAB, and if favourable to the industry proceed with the sale and ensure all proceeds of the sale are returned to the racing industry.

 - (d) identify the risk factors;
 - (e) assess and review the legislative and policy frameworks;
 - (f) assess and review service delivery and agency responses;
 - (g) the capacity of the Western Australia Police to identify and respond to allegations of elder abuse;
 - (h) identify initiatives to empower older persons to better protect themselves from risks of elder abuse as they age;
 - (i) consider new proposals or initiatives which may enhance existing strategies for safeguarding older persons who may be vulnerable to abuse; and
 - (j) consider any other relevant matter.
- (3) The Select Committee is to report by no later than 12 months after the motion is agreed to.
- (4) The Select Committee shall comprise of the following members
 - (a) Hon Nick Goiran, Chair;
 - (b) Hon Alison Xamon, Deputy Chair;
 - (c) Hon Matthew Swinbourn; and
 - (d) Hon Tjorn Sibma.

Point of Order

Hon Nick Goiran raised the following Point of Order —

Madam President, I ask if you could provide a ruling tomorrow on whether the *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (WA) Amendment Bill 2017*, which has just been received into the Council is a uniform legislation Bill. In particular, I draw to your attention a couple of things I have noted from the explanatory memorandum that has just been tabled by the Parliamentary Secretary, including that the Bill includes reforms to the Western Australian national law. The explanatory memorandum states that it will create a "national regulation of paramedics, including the establishment of a Para medicine Board of Australia". Obviously, I have not had the opportunity to consider this Bill in detail because it has just arrived in the House. Off the cuff, it seems that it will create new uniform laws for paramedics under a new scheme that does not exist. However, that was done, it was obviously done by some kind of bilateral or multilateral intergovernmental agreement. Therefore, this seeks to give effect to the regulation of paramedics, which I understand has not been the case previously.

Additionally, I draw to your attention, Madam President, that the explanatory memorandum states also that this Bill will enable "the COAG Health Council to make changes to the structure of National Boards by regulation ..." That immediately strikes me as something that might be a matter of parliamentary sovereignty and I would have thought that would especially be of interest to the Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review. I will leave it at that, Madam President. If you can provide a ruling tomorrow, that would be useful.
