For each of the years 2010–2011, 2011–2012, 2012–2013, and 2013–2014, what was the amount of royalties paid in respect of:

3186. Mr M. McGowan to the Premier:

Further to Question Without Notice No. 356 asked in 2009, in which the Premier referred to the Gindalbie Karara iron ore project as follows: "After seven months, this government, along with the EPA and the mining industry, has sorted out the problem. The mining tenement will be released. The A-class reserve will be established. The mine will go ahead. Oakajee will be built. The railway will be put in place. Construction on the mine will start later this year", I ask:

- (a) given the mine was granted approval five years ago, what steps has the Premier taken to honour his promise to establish an A-class reserve on Mungada Ridge;
- (b) did the Government seek and receive any written commitments from Gindalbie about its relinquishment of tenements to establish the reserve;
- (c) if yes to (b), will the Premier table any correspondence;
- (d) has any member of the Government written to Gindalbie at any time since 2009 asking the company to honour any agreement, and if not, why not; and
- (e) if yes to (d), will the Premier table any relevant correspondence?

3187. Mr C.J. Tallentire to the Minister for Mines and Petroleum:

I refer to Question Without Notice No. 1583 asked in 2013, and ask:

- (a) has the Minister or his department written to DSO Ventures Pty Ltd at any time since 2009 seeking relinquishment of tenement M59/650 (Mungada Ridge), as agreed by the Premier in that year, and if not, why not;
- (b) did the Minister or Department receive any written commitments from DSO Ventures Pty Ltd, or Gindalbie Metals Ltd, regarding the relinquishment of M59/650;
- (c) if yes to (b), when were those commitments received and will the Minister table them;
- (d) why has the Minister and Department refused to act on the Premier's instruction to facilitate the establishment of an A-class reserve?

3188. Mr M. McGowan to the Minister representing the Minister for Fisheries:

Further to Question Without Notice No. 2921 asked in 2014, in which the Department of Fisheries says it has spent \$1.23 million on research, compliance, policy and management of the marine pest Didemnum perlucidum in Western Australia:

- (a) what is the dollar value of the practical 'in water' effort to eradicate the pest;
- (b) given the pest was first detected on a Gorgon marine vessel in February 2012, what specific financial commitments have been sought by the Minister or Department and received from Chevron to assist in eradication efforts;
- (c) has the Department, as part of its aquatic biosecurity compliance responsibilities, considered prosecution of the company, and if not, why not;
- (d) what is the area in square kilometres in which the pest is now understood to have infested;
- (e) what Western Australian ports and marinas are now affected by this pest;
- (f) has the Department mapped the extent of the pest and if so, will it table the map;
- (g) has the Department made any specific approaches to other international biosecurity regulators where the marine pest is prevalent to discuss effective management approaches, and if not why not;
- (h) what percentage of the Barrow Island Marine Park and Marine Management Area are affected by this pest; and
- (i) has the marine pest reached any locations operating under aquaculture licences and, if so, which ones?
