Deputy Chairman's Ruling

The Deputy Chairman ruled as follows -

Hon Giz Watson has proposed two new clauses on the supplementary notice paper. I will have to make a Chairman's ruling on those proposals. I advise that I am unable to permit the Member to proceed with the next two amendments appearing on the supplementary notice paper. Under Standing Order 237(a), a committee may make an amendment to a Bill if the amendment is relevant to the subject matter of the Bill; that is, it must fall within the scope and purpose of the Bill as it was second read. It is not sufficient that an amendment fall within the title of the Bill, which in many cases simply recites that the Bill is one to amend a particular parent act. The amendment proposed by Hon Giz Watson, therefore, introduces a new principle to the Bill that is foreign to its intended scope and purpose. I therefore must rule the proposed amendments out of order.
