Point of Order

Hon Sue Ellery raised the following Point of Order —

During the course of that 80-minute Non-Government Business, two procedural motions were raised by the Leader of the House. The clock did not stop while the House was considering the procedural matters. The clock was stopped once you left the chair until the ringing of the bells, but Standing Order 15(4), "Non-Government Business", is quite clear that —

After the conclusion of formal business each Thursday, Non-Government Business shall be taken for a period of 80 minutes.

Indeed, there is another time-limited matter of Private Members' Business that we are about to enter that is, again, for a time-limited period of 60 minutes. It was not contemplated when we created this set of Standing Orders that it might be possible to use procedural motions to effectively chew up part of a time-limited debate. I would not want the events of this morning to set some kind of precedent by which, for example, the Government could use a series of procedural matters to chew into those 80 minutes. On the other hand, the opposition could stand during Private Members' Business to chew up part of that time in procedural debate. I ask you, Mr President, to take that on notice and give some consideration to what advice you might offer the House about how to ensure we have not this morning set a precedent that we do not want.
