# **THURSDAY, 27 NOVEMBER 2008**

#### 1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 a.m. pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

Prayers were read.

#### 2. Petitions

Truth in Sentencing – Mr A.J. Simpson presented a petition from 210 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly repeal the 'truth in sentencing' laws which reduce all sentences by one-third (P. 21).

Police and Citizens' Youth Club – Mr V.A. Catania presented a petition from 26 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly endorse the continued future of the Roebourne Police and Citizens' Youth Club and ensure that sufficient resources and funding are allocated to enable that to occur (P. 22).

Geraldton to Perth Passenger Train – Mr G.A. Woodhams presented a petition from 3,195 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly initiate a passenger train from Geraldton to Perth (P. 23).

Speaker's Statement – Legislative Council Message No. 3

The Speaker noted that the Legislative Council had only acquainted the Legislative Assembly of the appointment of one member, the Hon. Kim Chance, as a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Delegated Legislation. As members were aware, upon dissolution of the House in August this year all committees, including joint committees, ceased to exist. Although the standing committees appointed in this Parliament have the same terms of reference, powers and titles of those of the committees of the previous Parliament, they are entirely different committees, with different memberships.

It is the practice of each House to acquaint the other House of its membership on joint committees and the Speaker expected to receive advice of the other Council members appointed to the Committee in due course.

#### 7. Standing Committee on Education and Health

- (2) That the Member for Bassendean, the Member for Pilbara and the Member for Warnbro be co-opted to the Committee for the purposes of that inquiry.
- (3) That the Committee report to the Legislative Assembly by 18 June 2009.

Debate ensued.

Question put and passed.

## 8. Weapons (Supply to Minors and Enhanced Police Powers) Amendment Bill 2008

Ms M.M. Quirk, pursuant to notice, moved,

That a bill for "An Act to amend the *Weapons Act 1999* to prohibit the supply of controlled weapons to minors and to provide the Police Force with greater search powers in certain circumstances." be introduced and read a first time.

Question put and passed.

Ms M.M. Quirk presented an explanatory memorandum and bill read a first time.

Ms M.M. Quirk moved, That the second reading of the bill be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting of the House.

Question put and passed.

The Leader of the House, pursuant to notice, moved,

That so much of Standing Orders be suspended as is necessary to ensure the Address in Reply no longer has priority.
