CLARIFICATION OF EVIDENCE PROVIDED TO THE INQUIRY ON PRIVATE PROPERTY RIGHTS

Thank you for the opportunity to appear before the Standing Committee on Public Administration (Committee) to provide evident to assist its Inquiry into Private Property Rights (Inquiry). In addition to some minor suggested changes to my transcript of evidence (enclosed) I would also like to provide clarification with respect to my response to one of the Committee's questions.

During the hearing, I was asked:

Will the ARMA alter the circumstances in which compensation may be available for commercial fishers?

In response I advised:

My answer would be no; the FAS act and FRICM act will continue to apply.

This is a true statement which accurately reflects my understanding at the time. Since then, I have become aware that while the *Fisheries Adjustment Schemes Act* 1987 will continue to apply to authorisations and entitlement under ARMA (for example, Fishing Boat Licences or units of entitlement in managed fisheries), it will not be able to be applied to resource shares in a Managed Aquatic Resource. This is because the *Aquatic Resources Management Act* 2016 does not expand the scope of the *Fisheries Adjustment Schemes Act* 1987 to include this new type of entitlement for commercial fishers.
