INQUIRY INTO THE LOCAL PROJECTS LOCAL JOBS PROGRAM – REPONSE TO QUESTIONS TAKEN ON NOTICE

Questions taken on notice at hearing - Friday, 2 August 2019

Question: [Transcript p. 3, para 1] *Mr* Arulsingham undertook to confirm whether the grant agreement letters included details of the departmental officer responsible for administering the grant.

Response: The Department of Education, Department of Transport, and the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries had contact details of the officer in the agreement. Three of the agreements for the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development had specific officer contact details and the remaining 6 had a generic email address. The Department of Communities agreements also had a generic email address.

When our Office received the listing of the 81 projects from the Department of Premier and Cabinet, it included the names and contact details of each entity's contact officer for the Local Projects, Local Jobs program.

Question: [Transcript p. 4, paras 10-13] 'Just for clarity, of the 40 projects you took a deeper dive into, could you provide an indication of how many of those grant agreements specified job creation targets and identify which grant agreements they were, and perhaps whether or not there was any indication of that objective being fulfilled as a consequence of the agreement?'

Response: None of the agreements we examined contained a quantified job creation target.

For the 9 grant agreements in our sample that were administered by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD), 7 included a dedicated project outcome criterion titled 'jobs created' or 'jobs created – (how much funding will be directed to jobs, casual, temporary, permanent).' For these 7 agreements no target figure was provided for this criterion. The field was either left blank, or had a figure of 0%.

For the other two DPIRD agreements—and the samples we viewed across the Department of Transport, Department of Education, Department of Communities, and Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries—we could not find any reference to a jobs target included in the documentation representing the grant agreements.

Question: [Transcript p. 7, paras 11-17 – relating to the change of scope on the \$11,000 grant] *Did* the audit office observe an email from the Department of Premier and Cabinet clarifying the administrative arrangements required when there was a change of scope to the Department of Education's grant?

Response:

For the two instances identified in the audit results report where the change of scope was approved by the local member of Parliament for the area in which the schools were located, the OAG did not observe an email from the Department of Premier and Cabinet clarifying the administrative arrangements required when there was a change of scope to the Department of Education's grant.

Question: [Transcript p. 9, para 12, and p. 10, para 1] *I undertook to provide a list of the 40 projects from the list of 81 in the attachment to the OAG submission that were selected for a detailed examination by the audit team.*

Response: The 40 projects are listed for your reference in Appendix 1.

Question: [Transcript p. 16, paras 10-11, and p. 17, paras 1-3] *Can you confirm what sorts of evidence the Department of Communities provided to confirm completion of projects for the purposes of acquittal?*

Response: During our audit we observed that the Department of Communities' acquittal process only required the Grantee to sign a declaration that the project was finished. The acquittal did not require any visual verification (e.g. photos or site visit) of the completed project.

In our interim management letter to the Department (relevant excerpt included for your reference in Appendix 2) we recommended that management should enhance the acquittal process so that it includes a visual confirmation of the completed project.

FINDINGS IDENTIFIED DURING THE COURSE OF THE INTERIM AUDIT

1. Local Projects, Local Jobs Grants Testing - Acquittal Process

Finding

From the review of the Local Projects, Local Jobs Grants grant acquittal process, we observed that the Department only requires the Grantee to sign a declaration that the project was finished. However, the acquittal does not involve any visual verification of the completed project.

Rating: Moderate

Implication

In the absence of visual confirmation of the completed project, there is a risk that the money might be misappropriated for other purposes.

Recommendation

Management should enhance the acquittal process so that it includes a visual confirmation of the completed project.

Management Comment

All Local Projects and Local Jobs include reporting requirements consistent with the purpose of the Grant (see attached grant agreements). For Grants that include a works component, the reporting requirements include provision of a timeframe of the work undertaken, a detailed cost schedule and receipts for items in excess of \$1,000.

The Department will request Grant recipients to provide photographic evidence of completion of works to be included in their reports.
