#### Insurance Commission of Western Australia

## Supplementary information No F1: The Hon Sally Talbot MLC asked:

1) Are you anticipating a spike in industry related claims?

Answer: The Insurance Commission of Western Australia (Insurance Commission) receives advice from an independent actuary on estimated asbestos claim rates.

That advice indicates the peak exposure from heavy industrial use of asbestos from the 1920s to 2000 has passed.

The actuary estimates that a new wave of exposure from domestic and home renovation activities from the 1960s onwards will peak around 2021.

The Insurance Commission does not insure domestic and home renovation activities.

The Insurance Commission insures mine workers for exposure to asbestos dust from its Compensation (Industrial Diseases) Fund. The majority of asbestos claims paid by the Insurance Commission have been to former employees of the Wittenoom mine site between 1943 and 1966. This mine site has been closed for 50 years.
