Question No. E3: Hon ALANNA CLOHESY asked -

During the hearing, there was some discussion around an audit undertaken on Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) that provide the unit of competency directly linked to tilt-up construction. The outcomes/findings of the audit were requested.

Answer: Eight RTOs were audited with the following levels of overall compliance with the Standards for Registered Training Organisations 2015 at the initial audit:

- Compliant − 1
- Minor − 4
- Significant 1
- Critical 2

Following the standard rectification period of 20 working days, seven RTOs achieved compliance. One RTO remains non-compliant and the Training Accreditation Council agreed to suspend the registration of the RTO. The suspension will remain in place until the RTO can demonstrate compliance.
