Thank you for sending the report documents. Very impressive and comprehensive, hopefully NSW will consider something along the same lines.

My comments on the issues raised are as follows:

Comment 6

“.....(ways of) encouraging new crowded places to adopt security measures prior to their construction....”

- Provision of comprehensive design guidelines to assist designers, planners, authorities
- Building and planning legislation updated to ensure all new venues have undertaken a terrorist risk assessment and adopted appropriate counter measures in design phase
- Introduction of “Designing for counter terrorism” certificate course similar to CPTED.

Comment 10

“ .... (are) numbers-based definition of a crowded place useful”

- No, number-based definitions are counter-productive for situations that are highly contextual. A relatively small confined space may be crowded and as such become a suitable terrorist target

Comment 20

“whether a minimum standard of protection is desirable”

- Prescriptive standards encourage uniform approaches while a process-based approach will address context issues and allow creative opportunities more likely to be keeping with the local environment

Comment 22

“ additional legislative requirements for risk assessment and risk management processes”

- Current legislation concerning events should reflect the possibility of a terrorist type attack. Up front risk assessment would ensure that response is commensurate, limiting cost outlay for low risk events
