TO PARTICIPATE. HERE IS OUR SUBMISSION.

WE HAVE LIVED IN OUR PARK HOME SINCE NOVEMBER 2005 WE WERE VERBALLY ASSURED THAT THE PARK WAS VERY SAFE AND WOULD BE ONGOING AND THERE WAS NO WAY THE PARK WOULD BE SOLD. WE HAVE BEEN TO MEETINGS IN THE PARK WITH MANAGERS & THE PARK OWNERS AND WERE TOLD ANY RUMORS WE HAD HEARD WERE NOT TRUE AND THIS PARK WAS THE JEWEL IN THE CROWN SO WE WERE PUT AT PEACE THINKING EVERYTHING WAS GOING TO BE ALRIGHT AND THEN SIX MONTHS DOWN THE TRACK WE WERE GIVEN OUR EVICTION NOTICE.

THE PRESENT LEGISLATION HAS CAUSED GREAT ANXIETY TO BOTH OF US AS WE HAD SPENT A GREAT AMOUNT OF MONEY RENOVATING INSIDE AND OUTSIDE TO MAKE OUR PARK HOME OUR HOME FOR OUR RETIREMENT. BUT INSTEAD THE PAST SIX MONTHS HAS CAUSED US BOTH SO MUCH STRESS TRYING TO FIND SOMEWHERE ELSE TO

Put our home at a cost of between \$20,000 or more which will take our only bit of money we have left as we are both aged pensioners in our middle sixties.

It would be great if the legislation could be changed to help more parks and give residents security of tenure. As it is at the moment it is very unsafe for people like us to come into these parks.

We had a problem with the bond we paid in April 2008 it took till October 2008 to get it in our name with our signatures. On the bond it took six months to get it all sorted.

We would also like to see the park agreement which allowed us to be evicted without reason which we new nothing about.

We were never told of the rezoning and would like to know how tourism and the sporting complex will be accommodated now in this area.
