## INQUIRY INTO THE MANAGEMENT AND OVERSIGHT OF THE PERTH CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL PROJECT

## Question

- 1. How frequently have you, as Under Treasurer, reported to the Treasurer on matters dealt with by the Taskforce?
  - a. Is the frequency and content of your reporting the same as that provided by the Director General of Health to the Minister for Health?

## Answer

1. I, and the rest of the Treasury Executive, met (and continue to meet) weekly with the Treasurer on a broad range of topics – one of which was the Perth Children's Hospital (PCH) project. From November 2016 through to the recent machinery of government changes, PCH was a standing item on the agenda for the weekly meetings.

In addition to these weekly meetings, the Treasurer and Minister for Health were regularly briefed on the status of the PCH project — with 18 joint briefings conducted since August 2016. Treasury was represented at these meetings by the Executive Director, Strategic Projects and Asset Sales.

Furthermore, I reported to the Treasurer on the PCH project on an 'as required' basis, through various briefing notes on specific issues related to the project.

a. Treasury has no line of sight on the frequency and content of the reporting arrangements between the Director General of Health and the Minister for Health. Accordingly, I cannot comment on the similarity of reporting practices between the respective agencies.
