
Thoroughbred racing is having trouble maintaining interest amongst our young affluent generation. Growth in racing does seem an impossibility.

THE SCIENCE OF FRAMING.

Thoroughbred

Equine Racing. Numerical expression of purpose of each race. Race numbers reflect the class of animal in that "number" race. The total number of races reflect the standard of "Meeting".

RACES:-

1. Untouchable - Invincible (Foundation).
Race One is the foundation of the entire meeting. Hence a shaky wasteful meeting. Race one must be positively untouchable, reliably invincible, "Class". Fail here then the entire industry's effort fails.
2. Team of Two - United, But Brittle.
Race Two must be united with race one, with some lesser class; lesser; possibly brittle, form, Together they develop a team of two, build the entire industry.
3. The Very Best - Best of Intentions.
Race three "Showcases" the best available class of equines, on display that meeting.
>Can be Trophy Race, Also"
>Can be juveniles
>Can be Quality females
(Note: Race seven should be reserved for trophies)
4. Approaching Death - Death
Must be taken, by the lowest class of equines participating in the meeting. (No exceptions)
5. Manful; But has no Idea - Lacks Skills
A positive light must be shown in placing equines in race five.
6. Sick - Sickly - Spreading Sickness
All group one, "Classic" races, require equines to have staying abilities. Still we breed the wrong "type". This, sick - sickly- spreading sickness, "type" even have their own class. Recognise the type.
7. A Gamble - Gambler with Knowledge
Everyone "On-Course" enjoys trophy races at position race seven. The punters become involved, The bookies enjoy the rush, the "sponsor feels the limelight. Everyone "On-Course" enjoys trophy races at position race seven. Want to hear it again?
Note: Race Clubs do finish some meetings here. "7" is a gamble, a public liability gamble. Clubs would be Advised to forfeit a meeting instead of playing the gamble.
8. Partnership - Love & Luck - Coupling
All thoroughbred meetings have a "Signing Off" of the partnership between equine and punter. Its called "the Get Out Stakes". The trophy race - race seven - has left them smiling, or searching for the taxi fare home. Race eight is that insurance, that luck and love for the sport, the get out stakes, finishes "all race meetings".
9. Old - Growing Old - Old and Dying
Believe it or not many poorly informed clubs conduct nine races.
> "Trophy Race"
> "Get Out Stakes"
> "Old and Dying"
Now these same clubs are crying poor. They dug their own graves.
10. Fully Seen out its Day - Finished with.
Clubs also skyte of an embarrassment of entries. Shortly followed by extended entries and seven races, too bad so sad.
