Fracking will have a devastating impact on the WA environment and on the health of Western Australians.

Scientist and doctors around the world have pointed to the serious risks associated with shale gas fracking. Chemical used are known to be toxic causing skin, respiratory, liver, kidneys and nervous system damage. It can cause even more serious problems such as impacts on bone marrow causing anaemia and cancers such as leukaemia or lung cancer while others can affect the growth of children, even at very low levels of exposure.

Western Australia's water resources are scarce. Unconventional gas activity carries a serious threat to ground water contamination, surface water pollution and depletion of ground water aquifers.
