PUBLIC STATUTES OF THE SESSION (65).

EIGHTEENTH PARLIAMENT—THIRD SESSION.

Anatomy Act Amendment Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 20)—

An Act to amend the Anatomy Act, 1930, by amending the definition of "Commissioner" contained in section two thereof and to empower the Commissioner of Public Health for the time being under the Health Act, 1911-1919, to receive bodies of deceased persons for despatch, and to despatch such bodies, to approved Schools of Anatomy outside the State of Western Australia; and for other purposes incidental thereto. Introduced by the Minister for Health (Hon. E. Nulsen), 2nd October, 1946. Assent given.

Appropriation Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 52)—

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund and from Moneys to Credit of the General Loan Fund and from the Public Account certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the Year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, and to supplement grants made by the present Parliament during its last Session in adjustment of the Vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1945-46," for charges during the Year ended the 30th day of June, 1946; and to approve of certain expenditure under section forty-one of the Forests Act, 1918-1931. Introduced by the Treasurer (Hon. F. J. S. Wise), 13th December, 1946. Assent given.

Building Operations and Building Materials Control Act Amendment Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 56)—

An Act to continue the operation of the Building Operations and Building Materials Control Act, 1945. Introduced by the Premier (Hon. F. J. S. Wise), 13th November, 1946. Assent given.

Bulk Handling Act Amendment Act (10 Geo. VI., No. 2)—

An Act to amend the Bulk Handling Act, 1935-1943, by making provision for and with respect to the purchase by Co-operative Bulk Handling Limited of a limited number of shares of its members. Introduced by the Minister for Agriculture (Hon. J. T. Tonkin), 8th August, 1946. Assent given.

Business Names Act Amendment Act (10 Geo. VI., No. 11)—

An Act to amend section twenty-five of the Business Names Act, 1942. Introduced by Hon. W. D. Johnson, 14th August, 1946. Assent given.

Canning District Sanitary Site Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 57)—

An Act to render unlawful the use of portion of Canning Location 37 as a sanitary site. Introduced by Mr. Cross, 14th November, 1946. Assent given.

Cemeteries Act Amendment Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 28)—

An Act to amend the Cemeteries Act, 1897. Introduced by the Minister for Lands (Hon. A. H. Panton), 5th November, 1946. Assent given.

Charitable Collections Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 29)—

An Act to provide for the regulation and control of the collection of money or goods for charitable purposes, and to repeal the War Funds Regulation Act, 1939. Introduced by the Chief Secretary (Hon. W. H. Kitson), 30th October, 1946. Assent given.

City of Perth Scheme for Superannuation (Amendments Authorisation) Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 30)—

An Act to authorise certain amendments of a Scheme for Superannuation established by the City of Perth under the City of Perth Superannuation Fund Act, 1934. Introduced by Mr. Needham, 14th November, 1946. Assent given.

Coal Mines Regulation Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 63)—

An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to the inspection and regulation of Coal Mines and for other relative purposes. Introduced by the Minister for Mines (Hon. W. M. Marshall), 14th August, 1946. Assent given.

Companies Act Amendment Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 81)—

An Act to amend section one of the Companies Act, 1943. Introduced by the Minister for Justice (Hon. E. Nulsen), 20th November, 1946. Assent given.

Daylight Saving Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 16)—

An Act to provide for the time within a certain area of the State being, in certain circumstances, in advance of standard time during certain periods. Introduced by the Premier (Hon. F. J. S. Wise), 19th November, 1946. Assent given.

Eastern Goldfields Transport Board Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 32)—

An Act to constitute and regulate and confer powers on and to provide for the management of The Eastern Goldfields Transport Board; to take over, construct, maintain and work tramways within the districts of the Municipalities of Kalgoorlie and Boulder and the Kalgoorlie Road District; and to construct, maintain and work all other forms of road transport within the said districts and any adjoining road district, and to generate and supply electricity, to acquire from such firstmentioned local authorities their interests in certain agreements; and for other purposes incidental thereto. Introduced by the Premier (Hon. F. J. S. Wise), 13th November, 1946. Assent given.

Economic Stability Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 62)—

An Act to make provision for the preservation of Economic Stability and for other purposes. Introduced by the Premier (Hon. F. J. S. Wise), 4th December, 1946. Assent given.

Electoral (War Time) Act Amendment Act (10 Geo. VI., No. 5)—

An Act to amend the Electoral (War Time) Act, 1943, and to continue its operation. Introduced by the Minister for Justice (Hon. E. Nulsen), 13th August, 1946. Assent given.

Factories and Shops Act Amendment Act (No. 2) (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 47)—

An Act to amend section one hundred and one of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937. Introduced by the Honorary Minister (Hon. E. H. Gray), 15th October, 1946. Assent given.

Factories and Shops Act Amendment Act (No. 3) (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 60)—

An Act to amend the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937. Introduced by the Minister for Labour (Hon. A. H. Panton), 19th September, 1946. Assent given.

Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act Amendment Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 58)—

An Act to continue the operation of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1943. Introduced by the Minister for Lands (Hon. A. H. Panton), 29th November, 1946. Assent given.

Feeding Stuffs Act Amendment (10 Geo. VI., No. 3)—

An Act to amend section five of the Feeding Stuffs Act, 1928-1942, and for other relative purposes. Introduced by the Minister for Agriculture (Hon. J. T. Tonkin), 20th August, 1946. Assent given.

Financial Emergency Act Amendment Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 59)—

An Act to continue the operation of the Financial Emergency Act, 1934, as amended by the Financial Emergency Act Amendment Act, 1935. Introduced by the Minister for Lands (Hon. A. H. Panton), 6th November, 1946. Assent given.

Fisheries Act Amendment Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 22)—

An Act to amend the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940. Introduced by the Minister for the North-West (Hon. A. A. M. Coverley), 11th September, 1946. Assent given.

Fremantle Tramways and Electric Lighting Act Amendment Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 42)—

An Act to amend the Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Act, 1903-1943, to extend the powers provided therein. Introduced by Hon. F. E. Gibson, 10th December, 1946. Assent given.

Friendly Societies Act Amendment Act (10 Geo. VI., No. 13)—

An Act to amend sections seven and twelve of the Friendly Societies Act, 1894-1939. Introduced by the Chief Secretary (Hon. W. H. Kitson), 25th July, 1946. Assent given.

Government Employees (Promotions Appeal Board) Act Amendment Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 33)—

An Act to amend the Government Employees (Promotions Appeal Board) Act, 1945. Introduced by the Minister for Labour (Hon. A. H. Panton), 29th November, 1946. Assent given.

Hairdressers Registration Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 61)—

An Act to provide for the Registration of Hairdressers and for other purposes. Introduced by the Minister for Labour (Hon. A. H. Panton), 23rd October, 1946. Assent given.

Increase of Rent (War Restrictions) Act Amendment Act (10 Geo. VI., No. 10)—

An Act to amend section fifteen of the Increase of Rent (War Restrictions) Act, 1939-1945. Introduced by the Minister for Works (Hon. A. R. G. Hawke), 29th August, 1946. Assent given.

Industries Assistance Act Continuance Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 34)—

An Act to continue the operation of the Industries Assistance Act, 1915. Introduced by the Minister for Lands (Hon. A. H. Panton), 29th November, 1946. Assent given.

Land Act Amendment Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 35)—

An Act to amend the Land Act, 1933-1945. Introduced by the Minister for Lands (Hon. A. H. Panton), 23rd October, 1946. Assent given.

Land Alienation Restriction Act Continuance Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 23)—

An Act to continue the operation of the Land Alienation Restriction Act, 1944. Introduced by the Minister for Lands (Hon. A. H. Panton), 16th October, 1946. Assent given.

Legal Practitioners Act Amendment Act (10 Geo. VI., No. 18)—

An Act to amend section six of the Legal Practitioners Act, 1893-1945. Introduced by the Minister for Justice (Hon. E. Nulsen), 2nd October, 1946. Assent given.

Legislative Council (War Time) Electoral Act Amendment Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 45)—

An Act to enlarge the definition of "Qualified Member of the Forces" in the Legislative Council (War Time) Electoral Act, 1943; to repeal section sixteen, and to continue the operation of the said Act. Introduced by the Chief Secretary (Hon. W. H. Kitson), 5th December, 1946. Assent given.

Licensing Act Amendment Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 43)—

An Act to amend subsection three of section forty-six of the Licensing Act, 1911-1944. Introduced by the Minister for Justice (Hon. E. Nulsen), 22nd November, 1946. Assent given.

Loan Act, £5,050,000 (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 36)—

An Act to authorise the raising of a sum of Five million and fifty thousand pounds by Loan for the construction of certain Public Works and Other Services, and the re-appropriation of certain Loan moneys. Introduced by the Treasurer (Hon. F. J. S. Wise), 30th October, 1946. Assent given.

Loteries (Control) Act Amendment Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 44)—

An Act to amend sections three and ten of the Loteries (Control) Act, 1932-1944, and to provide for the retrospective operation of such amendments. Introduced by the Chief Secretary (Hon. W. H. Kitson), 4th December, 1946. Assent given.

Marketing of Barley Act (10 Geo. VI., No. 17)—

An Act to make provision for the marketing, sale and disposal of barley, to control its production for sale, to constitute a Western Australian Barley Marketing Board, and for other relative purposes. Introduced by the Minister for Agriculture (Hon. J. T. Tonkin), 28th August, 1946. Assent given.

Marketing of Potatoes Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 26)—

An Act to make provision for the Marketing, Sale and Disposal of Potatoes, to control their production for sale, to repeal the Potato Growers Licensing Act, 1941, and to constitute the Western Australian Potato Marketing Board; and for other relative purposes. Introduced by the Minister for Agriculture (Hon. J. T. Tonkin), 17th October, 1946. Assent given.

Medical Act Amendment Act (10 Geo. VI., No. 8)—

An Act to amend section eleven of the Medical Act, 1894-1940. Introduced by the Minister for Health (Hon. E. Nulsen), 8th August, 1946. Assent given.

Milk Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 27)—

An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to the regulation and organisation of the production, purchase, treatment, sale, and distribution of milk for use by consumers within the State; to repeal the Metropolitan Milk Act, 1932-1944, and the Dairy Cattle Compensation Act, 1926; and for other purposes. Introduced by the Minister for Agriculture (Hon. J. T. Tonkin), 8th August, 1946. A conference was held on the 13th December, and an agreement arrived at. Assent given.

Mines Regulation Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 54)—

An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to the inspection and regulation of mines, and for other relative purposes. Introduced by the Minister for Mines (Hon. W. M. Marshall), 29th October, 1946. Assent given.

Municipal Corporations Act Amendment Act (10 Geo. VI., No. 12)—

An Act to amend sections one hundred and eighty and two hundred and nineteen of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1945. Introduced by Mr. Perkins, 28th August, 1946. Assent given.

Nurses Registration Act Amendment Act (10 Geo. VI., No. 14)—

An Act to amend the Nurses Registration Act, 1921-1944, by making provision for the registration of tuberculosis nurses under that Act; and for other incidental purposes. Introduced by the Minister for Health (Hon. E. Nulsen), 4th September, 1946. Assent given.

Plant Diseases Act Amendment Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 25)—

An Act to amend the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1939, by making provision, subject to a poll being taken, for a Compulsory Fruit Fly Foliage Hailing Scheme within districts and for matters connected therewith and incidental thereto. Introduced by the Minister for Agriculture (Hon. J. T. Tonkin), 10th October, 1946. Assent given.

Purchasers' Protection Act Amendment Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 37)—

An Act to amend section ten of the Purchasers' Protection Act, 1933-1936. Introduced by the Minister for Justice (Hon. E. Nulsen), 4th December, 1946. Assent given.

Railway (Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe) Discontinuance Act (10 Geo. VI., No. 7)—

An Act to authorise the discontinuance of the operation of the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe Railway and for other purposes. Introduced by the Minister for Railways (Hon. W. M. Marshall), 25th July, 1946. Assent given.

Reserves Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 38)—

An Act relating to certain reserves and other land. Introduced by the Minister for Lands (Hon. A. H. Panton), 5th December, 1946. Assent given.

Road Closure Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 39)—

An Act for the closure of certain roads and portions thereof and for other purposes. Introduced by the Minister for Lands (Hon. A. H. Panton), 5th December, 1946. Assent given.

Road Districts Act Amendment Act (No. 1) (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 46)—

An Act to amend the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943, to make provision for hostels for school children. Introduced by Mr. Watts, 12th September, 1946. Assent given.

Road Districts Act Amendment Act (No. 2) (11 Geo. VI., No. 64)—

An Act to amend the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943. Introduced by the Honorary Minister (Hon. E. H. Gray), 21st November, 1946. Assent given.

Road Districts Act, 1919-1942, Amendment Act (10 Geo. VI., No. 9)—

An Act to amend the Road Districts Act, 1919-1942. Introduced by Hon. N. Keenan, 18th August, 1946. Assent given.

State Forest Access Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 40)—

An Act to authorise the purchase, acquisition, or resumption of certain Lands for the purposes of the Forests Act, 1918-1931. Introduced by the Minister for Forests (Hon. A. A. M. Coverley), 20th November, 1946. Assent given.

State Housing Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 51)—

An Act relating to Housing; to make better provision for housing and improving the housing standards and conditions in the State; to constitute and regulate and provide for the administration of a State Housing Commission to take the place of the Workers' Home Board; to repeal the Workers' Homes Act, 1911-1945; to provide for the transfer of certain assets, liabilities and powers from the said Workers' Homes Board to the said State Housing Commission; to provide for the erection, dealings with and the disposal of Houses and for Advances for Housing; and for other purposes. Introduced by the Premier (Hon. F. J. S. Wise), 11th September, 1946. A conference was held on the 13th December, and an agreement arrived at. Assent given.

State Transport Co-ordination Act Amendment Act (10 Geo. VI., No. 4)—

An Act to amend the State Transport Co-ordination Act, 1933-1940, by extending the application thereof, by exempting from licensing aircraft used for medical transport service, by authorising the Western Australian Transport Board to exempt vehicles from licensing and by incorporating, by repealing and re-enacting herein the provisions of the Road Transport Subsidy Act, 1937, and other relative purposes. Introduced by the Minister for Transport (Hon. W. M. Marshall), 14th August, 1946. Assent given.

State (Western Australian) Alunite Industry Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 53)—

An Act to authorise the establishment, maintenance and carrying on by the Government of the State, of works, plant and other undertakings in connection with the production and treatment of alunite deposits and sale of products derived from the carrying on of the said works, plant and other undertakings. Introduced by the Minister for Industrial Development (Hon. A. R. G. Hawke), 5th December, 1946. Assent given.

Supply Act (No. 1), £2,700,000 (10 Geo. VI., No. 1)—

An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Two Million Two Hundred Thousand Pounds, and from Moneys to Credit of the General Loan Fund Two Hundred Thousand Pounds, to the Service of the Year ending 30th June, 1947, and to apply out of the Public Account the sum of Three Hundred Thousand Pounds for the purpose of temporary Advances to be made by the Treasurer. Introduced by the Premier (Hon. F. J. S. Wise), 30th July, 1946. Assent given.

Supply Act (No. 2), £2,200,000 (10 Geo. VI., No. 15)—

An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of One Million Eight Hundred Thousand Pounds, and from Moneys to Credit of the General Loan Fund Four Hundred Thousand Pounds, to the Service of the Year ending 30th June, 1947. Introduced by the Premier (Hon. F. J. S. Wise), 16th October, 1946. Assent given.

Supreme Court Act Amendment Act (11 Geo. VI., No. 50)—

An Act to amend the Supreme Court Act, 1935, by making further provision for the enforcement of orders made by the Court directing payment of periodical sums; to amend sections one hundred and ten and one hundred and seventeen of the said Act, and for other relative purposes. Introduced by Mr. McDonald, 4th December, 1946. Assent given.

An Act to amend section twenty-one of the Traffic Act, 1919-1941. Introduced by Mr. Hill, 10th October, 1946. Assent given.

Transfer of Land Act Amendment Act (No. 1) (10 Geo. VI., No. 6)—

An Act to amend section one hundred and twenty-six of the Transfer of Land Act, 1893-1944. Introduced by the Minister for Justice (Hon. E. Nulsen), 8th August, 1946. Assent given.

Transfer of Land Act Amendment Act (No. 2) (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 21)—

An Act to amend section fourteen of the Transfer of Land Act, 1893-1944. Introduced by Mr. McDonald, 1st October, 1946. Assent given.

Vermin Act Amendment Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 49)—

An Act to amend the Vermin Act, 1918-1942. Introduced by the Minister for Agriculture (Hon. J. T. Tonkin), 8th August, 1946. Assent given.

Western Australian Trotting Association Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 55)—

An Act to constitute and incorporate a Western Australian Trotting Association and to declare its objects, functions and powers; to provide for the establishment of a Country Clubs' Benefit Fund and for other purposes incidental thereto. Introduced by the Chief Secretary (Hon. W. H. Kitson), 23rd October, 1946. Assent given.

Wheat Industry Stabilisation Act (10 and 11 Geo. VI., No. 65)—

An Act relating to the stabilisation of the Wheat Industry and to provide for the control of production of wheat. Introduced by the Minister for Agriculture (Hon. J. T. Tonkin), 8th August, 1946. A conference was held on the 13th December, and an agreement arrived at. Assent given.

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Bookmakers Bill—

A Bill to authorise, regulate and control Bookmaking; and to regulate the assessment, collection and distribution of a tax upon moneys paid or payable to Bookmakers in the course of betting transactions. Introduced by the Minister for Mines (Hon. W. M. Marshall), 12th September, 1946. Defeated on the second reading, 6th November, 1946.

Bread Act Amendment Bill—

A Bill to amend sections three, three B, three C, four, six, ten, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, seventeen A and eighteen of the Bread Act, 1903-1938; to make provision therein for the appointment of a Bread Industry Advisory Officer and to define his powers and duties; to provide for certain investigations and research; to limit and define the hours of work in relation to certain other foods; and for matters incidental thereto or connected therewith. Introduced by the Honorary Minister (Hon. E. H. Gray), 28th November, 1946. Motion for second reading amended on 11th December to prohibit debate being proceeded with until Government provided for clause in Bill to set up independent board with power to appoint scientific and other officers and to consider the abolition of zoning. Bill lapsed.

Cattle Industry Compensation Bill—

A Bill to make provision for the establishment of a fund for the payment of compensation to the owners of cattle and carcases of cattle in certain cases and for the purposes connected therewith. Introduced by the Minister for Agriculture (Hon. J. T. Tonkin), 8th August, 1946. The second reading was moved on 12th September. The Bill was taken into committee on 19th September. Discharged 11th December, 1946.

Coal Production Bill—

A Bill to secure Production of Coal, to provide for Distribution of Coal, and to constitute a Tribunal to deal with Industrial Matters, and for incidental purposes. Introduced by the Minister for Mines (Hon. W. M. Marshall), 4th December, 1946. Defeated in the Council on the second reading, 12th December, 1946.

Comprehensive Agricultural Areas and Goldfields Water Supply Bill—

A Bill to approve the Scheme described in a document intitled "Comprehensive Agricultural and Goldfields Water Supply Scheme"; to adopt the recommendations made therein and to authorise the construction of works in accordance therewith and the putting of the Scheme into operation. Introduced by the Minister for Works (Hon. A. R. G. Hawke), 2nd October, 1946. Received in the Council, 19th November. Bill returned to the Assembly with an amendment relating to exclusion of farmers from scheme. The Council's amendment was not accepted by the Assembly and was referred to a conference, which failed to reach agreement and thus the Bill was lost.

Constitution Act Amendment Bill—

A Bill to further amend the Constitution Act, 1889, and the Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1899 (as amended by the Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1921). Introduced by Hon. Sir Hal Colebatch, 3rd September, 1946. Defeated on the second reading 28th November, a constitutional majority in favour not being obtained.

Country Areas Water Supply Bill—

A Bill to make provision for the construction, maintenance and administration of reticulated supplies of water to country areas; to repeal the Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902-1942; to amend the Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage

Act, 1912, and for other incidental purposes. Introduced by the Minister for Works (Hon. A. R. G. Hawke), 1st October, 1946. Received in the Council, 19th November. Bill returned to the Assembly with amendments relating to the system of rating under the scheme. The Council's amendments were not accepted by the Assembly and were referred to a conference, which failed to reach agreement and thus the Bill was lost.

Electoral Act Amendment Bill (No. 1)—

A Bill to amend section seventeen of the Electoral Act, 1907-1940. Introduced by Mr. Watts, 8th August, 1946. Defeated on the second reading, 28th August, 1946.

Introduced by the Minister for Railways (Hon. W. M. Marshall), 4th December, 1946. Defeated in the Council on the second reading, 12th December, 1946.

Imprisonment for Betting Abolition Bill—

A Bill to abolish the penalty of imprisonment on persons convicted of certain misdemeanours or offences of which betting is an element or whose conviction is secured by evidence of betting and to fix minimum pecuniary penalties for which persons shall be liable on conviction for such misdemeanours or offences. Introduced by Mr. Watts, 13th November, 1946. The second reading was moved 27th November, but was not further proceeded with.

Legislative Council Referendum Bill—

A Bill to submit to a Referendum certain questions in relation to the Legislative Council as a constituent part of the Parliament of the State. Introduced by the Minister for Justice (Hon. E. Nulsen), 8th August, 1946. Defeated in the Council on the second reading, 15th October, 1946.

Introduced by the Minister for Agriculture (Hon. J. T. Tonkin), 8th August, 1946. Second reading moved 20th August, but not further proceeded with. Discharged, 27th August, 1946.

Marketing of Potatoes Bill (No. 1)—
