TENTH PARLIAMENT-FOURTH SESSION.

Appropriation Act (11 Geo. V., No. 34)—

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund and from Moneys to. Credit of the Trust Fund and the General Loan Fund and from the Public Account certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the Service of the Year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and to supplement grants made, by the present Parliament during its last Session in adjustment of the Vote, "Advance to Treasurer, 1919-20," for charges during the Year ended the 30th day of June, 1920, and to approve of the Scheme of Expenditure, under Section forty-one of the Act No. 8 of 1919. Introduced by the Colonial Treasurer (Hon. J. Mitchell), 14th December, 1920. Assent. given.

Bayswater Drainage Act (11 Geo. V., No. 29)-

An Act to enable the Bayswater Road Board to borrow money for the payment of compensation in respect of certain drainage works in the Bayswater Road District. Introduced by the Minister for Works (Hon. W. J. George) 2nd December, 1920. Assent given.

Broome Rates Validation Act (11 Geo. V., No. 4)-

An Act to validate certain rates made and levied by the Council of the Municipality of Broome, and to enable the Broome Road Board to recover such rates. Introduced by the Premier (Hon. J. Mitchell) 5th August, 1920. Assent given.

Building Societies Act (11 Geo. V., No. 20)-

An Act to amend the law relating to Building Societies. Introduced by the Attorney General (Hon. T. P. Draper) 31st August, 1920. Assent given.

Carriers Act (11 Geo. V., No. 8)-

An Act to amend the law relating to common carriers. Introduced by the Attorney General (Hon. T. P. Draper) 2nd September, 1920. Assent given.

Charitable Purposes Income Deduction Act (11 Geo. V., No. 47)-

An Act to allow a deduction, for the purpose of assessing income tax, of payments made for certain charitable and public purposes. Introduced by the Colonial Treasurer (Hon. J. Mitche)l 23rd December, 1920. Assent given.

City of Perth Endowment Lands Act (11 Geo. V., No. 31)-

An Act to extend the boundaries of the City of Perth, and to give the City of Perth powers of dealing with certain endowment and other lands. Introduced by the Attorney General (Hon. T. P. Draper) 2nd September, 1920. Assent given.

Coroners Act (11 Geo. V., No. 24)-

An Act relating to Coroners. Introduced by the Attorney General (Hon. T. P. Draper) 31st August, 1920. Assent given.

Dentists Act Amendment Act (11 Geo. V., No. 51)-

An Act to amend the Dentists Act, 1894. Introduced by the Attorney General (Hon. T. P. Draper) 31st August, as an Act to provide for the registration of dentists and the qualification of dental practitioners. Reduced to an amending Act on 17th December, 1920. Assent given.

Dividend Duties Act Amendment Act (11 Geo. V., No. 32)-

An Act to further amend the Dividend Duties Act, 1902. Introduced by the Premier (Hon. J. Mitchell) 9th November, 1920. Assent given.

Divorce Act Amendment Act (11 Geo. V., No. 52)-

An Act to further amend the law relating to divorce and matrimonial causes. Introduced by the Attorney General (Hon. T. P. Draper) 9th November, 1920. Assent reserved.

Factories and Shops Act (11 Geo. V., No. 44)—

An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to the supervision and regulation of factories and shops. Introduced by the Minister for Mines (Hon. J. Scaddan) 31st August, 1920. Assent given.

- High School Act Amendment Act (11 Geo. V., No. 6)—

- Lunacy Act Amendment Act (11 Geo. V., No. 42)—
 An Act to amend the Lunacy Act, 1903. Introduced by the Colonial Secretary (Hon. F. T. Broun) 30th September, 1920. Assent given.
- Meekatharra-Horseshoe Railway Act (11 Geo. V., No. 46)—
