## INTRODUCTION

This paper provides a summary of the 2013 Western Australian election. It contains details of voting for all Legislative Assembly districts and Legislative Council regions, as well as relevant summary statistics for both chambers.

The 2013 election was the first held following the introduction of fixed date elections. It was conducted on new electoral boundaries, though the number of members in both chambers, as well as the distribution of electorates between Perth and non-metropolitan areas, remained unchanged.

### Format for Legislative Assembly Results.

For each Legislative Assembly district, details of the first preference votes and percentages received by each candidate are provided, as well as the final count after the distribution of preferences. Where appropriate, an alternative two-party preferred count is included. The format of the results is as follows:

First Count: The total of first preferences for each candidate is shown, with the candidate's percentages calculated by dividing the first preference vote by the formal vote. Swing is calculated by subtracting the percentage vote received by the party at the 2008 election from the percentage received at the 2013 election. Where the parties contesting the district differ from the 2008 election, 'ghost' candidates (indicated by '...') have been included to represent candidates not contesting the current election. All results from 2008 have been adjusted to take account of the redistribution.

Final Count: Represents the two-candidate preferred count after the full distribution of preferences. Ballot papers that did not include a preference choosing between the final two candidates are included in the total for 'Exhausted' votes. Two-candidate preferred percentages are calculated by dividing the two-candidate preferred vote for each candidate by the total votes remaining in the count that is the formal vote minus the exhausted votes. Two-candidate preferred swings are shown compared to the results of the 2008 election adjusted for the redistribution. Where the party composition of the final two candidates differs from the 2008 election (e.g. Kalgoorlie), ghost candidates appear and three swing figures are shown.

2-Party Preferred: This total appears in electorates that did not finish as a contest between Labor and Liberal candidates. It shows the alternate two-party preferred count between Labor and Liberal candidates, as well as change in percentage vote since the 2008 election.

### Two-Candidate Preferred versus Two-Party Preferred Results

The two-candidate preferred count for an electorate is defined as the final tally after the formal distribution of preferences, which is conducted by the successive exclusion of the lowest polling candidates and re-examination of their ballot papers to determine the next valid preference. The two-party preferred count represents a similar distribution of preferences, but at all stages retains the final two candidates as representatives of the Labor and Liberal Parties.

In 49 of the 59 Legislative Assembly electorates, the final two-candidate preferred was also the two-party preferred count between Labor and Liberal candidates. In eight electorates the final two-candidate preferred count was between Liberal and National candidates (Central Wheatbelt, Eyre, Geraldton, Kalgoorlie, Moore, North West Coastal, Wagin, Warren-Blackwood), one finished as a Labor-National contest (Pilbara) while Kwinana was a contest between Labor and an Independent candidate.

In these ten electorates, the Electoral Commission conducted a second distribution of preferences between Labor and Liberal candidates to produce a two-party preferred count. This included an extra count in Pilbara, where the Labor-National finish could have been used as the two-party preferred, as it was at the 2008 election.

Throughout this publication, the Labor-Liberal count for Pilbara has been used as the two-party preferred total, but appropriate reference is given to the Labor-National finish and how this compares with the 2008 election result.

In 2008 the WAEC did not conduct this second count in Pilbara and the Labor-National count was used as the two-party preferred total. In the analysis of two-party preferred totals beginning on page 20, an alternate state wide two-party preferred is provided using the Labor-National count in Pilbara. At various points in this publication, both margins against Labor are used for Pilbara, with relevant references included in notes.

### **Defining Holding Parties and Sitting Members**

The party status of the three electorates listed below has been modified to take account of by-elections, changes in party affiliation and the redistribution.

- Fremantle was won by Labor at the 2008 election, but lost to Green candidate Adele Carles at a May 2009 by-election. Carles became an Independent in May 2010 and re-contested the 2013 election as an Independent. Fremantle has been classed as Independent held.
- Morley was won by Liberal candidate Ian Britza in 2008, but the redistribution turned his seat into a notional Labor seat. Britza contested the 2013 election, is shown as a sitting member and was re-elected, but the seat has been classed as notionally Labor held and listed as a Liberal gain.
- North West was won for Labor by Vince Catania at the 2008 election. In July 2009 he left Labor and joined the Nationals. The redistribution subsequently re-named the seat North West Central, the new boundaries also notionally overturning the Labor majority. North West Central has been classified as National held based on Catania being the sitting member.

North West Central was one of four electorates with a new name at the 2013 election. The other three electorates to change name were Mindarie (formerly Butler), Nollamara (Mirrabooka) and Blackwood-Stirling (Warren-Blackwood).

Given these changes, the starting point of party holdings for the 2013 election was Labor 27 (losing Fremantle and North West Central, gaining Morley), Liberal 23 (losing Morley), Nationals five (gaining North West Central) and Independents four (gaining Fremantle).

All sitting members of the Legislative Assembly are indicated with “\*”. This includes Ian Britza in Morley, and Brendon Grylls is also listed as a sitting member despite leaving Central Wheatbelt and contesting the Labor-held electorate of Pilbara.

A summary of defeated and newly elected members for both the Assembly and the Council is provided on page 52.

### **Summary of Redistribution**

A summary of the 2011 redistribution can be found on page 54. It includes old and new margins for all seats, along with notes on retiring members. More detail on the redistribution can be found in “*2011 Redistribution Western Australia: Analysis of Final Electoral Boundaries*”, Western Australian Parliamentary Library Election Papers Series No. 1/2011.

### **By-elections and Casual Vacancies**

Details of the Fremantle, Willagee and Armadale by-elections can be found on Page 57. Details of Legislative Council casual vacancies can be found on the same page. By-elections were conducted on the old electoral boundaries and all calculations of swing are compared to the actual results of the 2008 election.

## **Christian Democratic Party/Australian Christians**

The Christian Democratic Party changed its name to Australian Christians ahead of the 2013 election. At all times in analysing the results of the 2013 election, changes in vote are calculated by comparing support for the Australian Christians against support for the Christian Democrats in 2008. The affiliation 'CDP' has been retained for the three by-elections conducted during the life of the parliament.

## **Exhausted Votes**

Under the WA Electoral Act, ballot papers with a valid first preference vote but with duplicate or broken sequences of preferences, can remain in the count as formal votes, but they 'exhaust' their preferences before reaching one of the final two candidates in the contest. Ballot papers of this type are often called 'Langer' votes, a reference to the political activist who advocated voting in this manner when the same formality rules applied for Commonwealth elections. The small number of exhausted ballots is indicated in the result for each electorate.

## **Legislative Assembly Electorates Decided on Preferences.**

Preference distributions were conducted in all 59 electorates, but in 29 of these contests, the winning candidates polled more than 50% of the first preference vote. Of the 29 electorates where preferences were not required, 23 were won by the Liberal Party, five by Labor and one, Wagin, by the National Party.

Thirty electorates were decided on preferences. The Liberal Party won eight contests where preferences were required to be distributed. Of the sixteen electorates won by Labor on preferences, two (Maylands, Midland) saw Labor win after trailing on first preferences, where three other contests (Albany, Collie-Preston, Kimberley) saw Labor win after leading on first preferences but trailing the combined Liberal and National Party vote at all stages of the count. The National party won six electorates on preferences, including two (Kalgoorlie, Moore) where the party trailed on first preferences.

Labor preferences were distributed in eight electorates that finished as Liberal-National contests. In a break with past practice, the Labor Party did not direct preferences to the National Party in all electorates. In seven of these eight electorates, the Labor candidate was the last to be excluded. In the three electorates where Labor recommended preferences to National candidates, the flow of Labor preferences averaged 79.2%. In the four electorates where Labor recommended preferences to the Liberal Party, the flow of Labor preferences to the National Party averaged only 55.2%.

## **Format for Legislative Council Results**

Results for the Legislative Council are provided in several formats beginning on page 31. Overall Council totals are provided as well as summary tables of the change in party vote in each region. The Legislative Council tables display party totals as both percentages and quotas of votes.

Following the summary tables, a more detailed breakdown of support by candidate and ballot paper group is provided for each region. The total number of ticket votes for each group is shown as well as the percentage of each group's vote that were ticket votes. Sitting members, elected and defeated candidates are shown.

A summary of the distribution of preferences follows the detailed table for each region. In several regions, in particular Agricultural as well as Mining and Pastoral, the final seat was filled by complex flows of party preferences determined by the registered ticket votes. The summaries attempt to explain how the final vacancy was filled in each region.



### **Acknowledgement and Disclaimer**

I would like to express my thanks to the staff of the Western Australian Electoral Commission for their assistance in preparing this publication. All results have been taken from the WAEC's web site (<http://www.elections.wa.gov.au/>) and drafts of the official Statistical Returns.

## Summaries of Preference Distributions

The tables on the following pages provide a summary of the final preference distributions for the Greens, for National, Labor and Liberal candidates where distributed, and for a small number of significant Independent candidates.

The tables have been derived from the final candidate exclusions in the formal distribution of preferences published by the Western Australian Electoral Commission. The final exclusion is the point when only three candidates remain in the count.

Except for the four electorates contested by only three candidates, the preference distributions include ballot papers already distributed from fourth and lower finishing minor party and independent candidates. The percentage vote for other candidates as well as the party composition of these candidates is shown in the final column. The small total of exhausted preferences have been ignored.

The Average values have been derived from averaging the preference flows in each electorate, not from totalling the preference flows. Had total preference flows been calculated, they would have given much greater weight to seats where the distributed party had its highest primary vote.

Labor had no sitting members re-contesting East Metropolitan Region at the 2013 election. Linda Savage was not re-endorsed by the Labor Party, while Ljiljana Ravlich moved to contest North Metropolitan Region.

On the first counts, the three sitting Liberals MLCs were re-elected, Helen Morton (Elected 1), Donna Faragher (Elected 3) and Alyssa Hayden (Elected 5). Two new Labor MLCs were also elected, Alanna Clohesy (Elected 2) and Samantha Rowe (Elected 4).

From the first preference tallies it was evident the final seat in East Metropolitan Region would be a race between sitting Greens MLC Alison Xamon and the third Labor candidate Amber Jade Sanderson. Towards the end of the count, only four candidates remained in the contest. The ticket preferences for Family First, the Shooters and Fishers and all three Independents had been directed to Australian Christian candidate Dwight Randall.

The totals for each candidate at this point are in the table below. The 'Transfers' column in the first table represents the change in party total since the count of first preferences, less the votes set aside for elected candidates.

At a similar point in the count in 2008, Randall had been excluded, electing the third Liberal candidate and then Xamon ahead of a third Labor candidate. Sitting Labor MLC Ed Dermer retired at the 2013 election, replaced on the Labor ticket by Labor MLC for East Metropolitan Region Ljiljana Ravlich. Greens MLC Giz Watson did not re-contest her seat, instead moving to contest South West Region for the Greens.

On the first preference count and initial preference distributions, the five sitting members were re-elected, Liberals Peter Collier (Elected 1), Michael Mischin (Elected 3) and Liz Behjat (Elected 5), and Labor's Ken Travers (Elected 2) and Ljiljana Ravlich (Elected 4). The Liberal Party total was just short of four quotas, leaving fourth Liberal candidate Peter Katsambanis on the cusp of election.

The Liberal total fell slightly in subsequent counts, and by the time only seven candidates remained, Katsambanis was 467 votes short of the quota, as shown below. Independent Michael Tucack had gathered preferences from the other three Independents to reach fourth place. In the first table below, 'Transfers' represents the change in totals by party since the count of first preferences, less the votes set aside for elected candidates.

On the first counts, the three sitting Liberals MLCs were re-elected, Simon O'Brien (Elected 1), Nicolas Goiran (Elected 3) and Phil Edman (Elected 5), as were the two sitting Labor MLCs, Sue Ellery (Elected 2) and Kate Doust (Elected 4).

The contest for the final seat in South Metropolitan Region was very similar to the race in East Metropolitan Region, being a contest between the third Labor candidate Anne Wood and the sitting Greens MLC Lynn MacLaren. Most minor party and Independent preference tickets were directed to Australian Christian candidate Bob Burdett, allowing him to pull ahead of the fourth Liberal candidate during the distribution of preferences.

The table below lists the totals for each candidate at the point where only four candidates remained. The 'Transfers' column in the first table represents the change in party total since the count of first preferences, less the votes set aside for elected candidates.

The National Party had elected three MLCs in 2008, but none re-contested for the party at the 2013 election. Mia Davies contested and won Central Wheatbelt in the Legislative Assembly, while Max Trenorden and Philip Gardiner re-contested as part of an Independent ticket. Sitting Labor MLC Matt Benson-Lidholm re-contested, but was in the difficult position to win second place on the Labor ticket.

On the initial count and distribution of party first preferences, five members were elected. Sitting Liberals Jim Chown (Elected 1) and Brian Ellis (Elected 4) were re-elected. Two new Nationals were elected, Martin Aldridge (Elected 2) and Paul Brown (Elected 5), as was a new Labor MLC, Darren West (Elected 3).

At this point no group on the ballot paper had more than 0.4 of a quota, which meant the order candidates finished and the deals done with party preference tickets were set to determine the final seat. The table below shows totals at the point where only eight candidates remained, six other independent groups having been excluded. In this first table the 'Transfers' column represents the change in party total since first preferences after setting aside votes for elected candidates.

Sitting Liberal MLC Norman Moore retired at the 2013 election, while National MLC Wendy Duncan contested and won Kalgoorlie in the Legislative Assembly. Labor MLC Helen Bullock did not re-contest, and Labor's other MLC Jon Ford was in the unwinnable fourth position on the Labor ticket.



On the first count four MLCs were elected. Liberal Ken Baston (Elected 1) was re-elected, and Mark Lewis (Elected 4) won the Liberal Party's second seat. New National candidate Jacqui Boydell (Elected 2) won the seat previously held by Wendy Duncan, while Labor's Stephen Dawson (Elected 3) became the region's new Labor MLC.

The table below shows the overall totals when only eight candidates remained in the count. On first preferences the National total had fallen just short of two quotas. By the count shown below, second National candidate Dave Grills was still 401 votes short of a quota. The total in the 'Transfers' column in this first table represents the change in party totals since the count of first preferences after setting aside the quotas of elected candidates.

If all votes in the count were ticket votes, then the Green's Robin Chapple would be the fifth member elected, and preference tickets would go on to elect Shooters and Fishers candidate John Parkes to the final vacancy. With a significant number of non-ticket votes in the count, the race between Parkes and second National candidate Dave Grills was set to be close.

On the first count five MLCs were re-elected, Liberals Robyn McSweeney (Elected 1), Barry House (Elected 3) and Nigel Hallett (Elected 5), as well as Labor's Sally Talbot (Elected 2) and Adele Farina (Elected 4). The race for the final seat was now between sitting National Colin Holt, and the Green's Giz Watson, a sitting MLC for North Metropolitan Region who had shifted to contest South West Region in a quest to win a seat for the party.

Eight Labor members left the Assembly in 2013. Three were defeated, two retired in seats retained by Labor and three retired in seats lost by Labor. Four Independents left the Assembly, two by retirement and two by defeat. Both the Liberal and National Parties had one retirement, in both instances the party retaining the seat with a new member.

There were 14 new members elected to the Legislative Assembly at the 2013 election, including two members transferring from the Legislative Council. There were eight new Liberal members, one elected in an existing Liberal electorate and seven in seats gained by the Liberal Party. Three new Nationals were elected to the Assembly, two from existing National seats and one from a gained seat, while Brendon Grylls also switched seats and gained Pilbara from Labor. Three new Labor MPs were elected, two from existing Labor seats and one from Labor's victory in Fremantle.

John Quigley won Butler (previously Mindarie), Janine Freeman Mirrabooka (previously Nollamara), and Terry Redman Warren-Blackwood (previously Blackwood Stirling). In addition, Vince Catania won North West in 2008 as a Labor candidate, and won the re-named North West Central in 2013 as a National candidate.

Four seats changed between the parties in the Legislative Council. Labor gained a seat from the Greens in East Metropolitan Region, the Liberal Party from the Greens in North Metropolitan. The Shooters and Fishers gained a seat from the Nationals in Agricultural region, while the Nationals gained a seat from Labor in Mining and Pastoral.

Four members did not contest the election, three Labor and one Liberal. Six members were defeated, two Labor, two Independent ex-Nationals and two Greens, including one green defeated contesting a different region. One Labor member switched regions successfully, and two Nationals won election to the Legislative Assembly.
