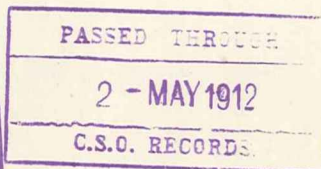

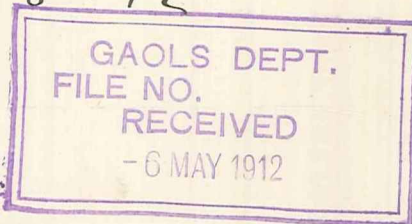

Prison, dated 29/4/1911, file, 878/1911.

(47). SUPPLY OF PRISON CLOTHING.

Complaint was made of the inadequate supply of prison clothing, & the matter might be looked into by the prison officials. I understand the supply of blankets is the same in winter as in summer: in winter the supply should be increased.
