1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 1.00pm pursuant to order.

The President, Hon Kate Doust, took the Chair and read prayers.

2. Petitions

Hon Nick Goiran presented a petition from 7,243 petitioners requesting the Legislative Council to establish an inquiry into induced premature births in Western Australia and the circumstances surrounding the deaths of babies born alive as a result of an abortion. (Tabled Paper 811).

Hon Jacqui Boydell presented a petition from 384 petitioners requesting the Legislative Council to investigate and repeal the *Fluoridation of Public Water Supplies Act 1966*. (Tabled Paper 812).

Hon Robin Scott presented a petition from 625 petitioners requesting the Legislative Council to oppose the proposed gold royalty increase. (Tabled Paper 813).

4. Criminal Procedure Amendment (Trial by Judge Alone) Bill 2017

Hon Aaron Stonehouse: To move on the next day of sitting —

That a Bill for "An Act to amend the *Criminal Procedure Act 2004*." be introduced and read a first time.

5. National Disability Insurance Scheme

Motion No. 1 having been called, debate resumed on the motion of Hon Alison Xamon as follows — That this House notes the significant impacts on people with disability and their families of ongoing uncertainty about which form of NDIS will be adopted in Western Australia.

Whether the Government decides to adopt the NDIS or the NDIS My Way model, it is imperative that those whose lives will be most affected by the decision are kept informed in an ongoing and meaningful way.

Furthermore, it is essential that a co-design model for engagement that involves people with disability and their families in the design of governance, policy and operational aspects is developed to inform the delivery of whichever scheme is agreed to.

Noting the significant uncertainty in the funding of disability services in Western Australia, this House calls upon the Government to ensure that there are mechanisms in place to —

- (a) ensure people with disability and their representative organisations are included in governance structures and inform service delivery design; and
- (b) that the decision making process is fully transparent.

Question — put and passed.

6. Metronet

Motion No. 2 having been called, Hon Alanna Clohesy, pursuant to notice, moved —

That this House congratulates the McGowan Government on its Metronet policy and notes the benefits Western Australia will derive, including the jobs to be created, from this transport and planning initiative.
