1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 1.00pm pursuant to Temporary Orders.

4. Select Committee into the Operations of the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Western Australia (Inc) — Interim Report — Extension of Time

- (4) A court may only make an order under subsection (1)(b) if the court is satisfied that the offender will comply with the conditions stated in the order.
- (5) The offender has the onus of satisfying the court as described in subsection
 (4) and the court has to be satisfied
 - (a) by acceptable and cogent evidence; and
 - (b) to a high degree of probability.
- (6) In deciding whether to make an order under subsection (1)(b), the court must disregard the fact that the person will be subject to electronic monitoring if an order under subsection (1)(b) is made.
