NON-GOVERNMENT BUSINESS

1. Communications between the Minister for Environment and the Environmental Protection Authority

Hon Dr Steve Thomas to move —

That this House calls on the Minister for Environment to provide a complete and transparent account to the House of —

- (a) what communication took place between the Minister and the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) in relation to the EPA guidelines released last week that would require the offset of any residual (net) direct emissions associated with a proposal with scope 1 emissions in excess of 100,000 tonnes per annum;
- (b) what communications took place between the Ministers' office or any of his staff and the EPA on this issue;
- (c) what communications took place between any other Minister and the EPA on this issue;
- (d) what stakeholder communication did the EPA undertake with potentially affected parties/businesses prior to issuing its new guidelines; and
- (e) what steps will the Government take to stop the EPA guidelines being enforced in every future EPA assessment of projects with scope 1 emissions in excess of 100,000 tonnes per annum.
