THURSDAY, 16 MAY 2013

1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 a.m. pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

Prayers were read.

2. Petition

Alcoa Waste Residue Storage – Mr M.J. Cowper presented a petition from 60 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly support their campaign to make Alcoa's application for the expansion of its waste residue storage at Pinjarra a substantial amendment, rather than a minor amendment (P. 6).

3. Papers

- small business tax cuts; and
- the 24 hour Ballajura police station.
