1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 1.00pm pursuant to Temporary Orders.

The President, Hon Barry House, took the Chair and read prayers.

2. Statement by President — Legislative Council Procedural Note for Members No. 7 (2015)

The President made the following Statement —

I want to clarify a situation that has arisen a couple of times in the last week. I draw Members' attention to the *Legislative Council Procedural Note for Members No. 7 (2015)*, which will be shortly distributed to their desks. This document clarifies the Standing Orders and procedures the Legislative Council has agreed to adopt when amendments to motions are made and referral of Bills motions to committees are proposed. In short, our Standing Orders dictate that these debates are specific to the motion moved and are to be dealt with as separate motions before reverting to the original question before the Chair. Speaking times for Members have been adjusted accordingly.

3. Petition

Hon Robin Chapple presented a petition from 132 petitioners requesting the Legislative Council to withdraw the *Aboriginal Heritage Amendment Bill 2014*; establish an inquiry into the Department of Aboriginal Affairs' management of Aboriginal heritage in Western Australia; and form a Select Committee to develop a proper framework to reform the *Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972* by involving Aboriginal peoples in meaningful ways and by building on previous suggestions from previous reviews. 4. Ministerial Statement — Mental Health Act 2014 — Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Incidents to the Chief Psychiatrist
