1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 a.m. pursuant to adjournment.

City of Stirling – Mrs L.M. Harvey presented a petition from 192 persons requesting the Legislative Assembly to request that the Minister for Planning approve amendment 32 of the State Residential Design Codes, without modification, as supported by the Council of the City of Stirling (P. 268).
