NON-GOVERNMENT BUSINESS

1. Electoral Amendment (Ticket Voting and Associated Reforms) Bill 2019 (Notice given 20 March 2019)

Hon Alison Xamon: To move —

That a Bill for "An Act to amend the *Electoral Act 1907* be introduced and read a first time.

2. Environmental Protection Authority's Greenhouse Gas Emissions Guidelines

Hon Tim Clifford to move —

That this House —

- (a) condemn the McGowan Government's interference with the operations of an independent statutory authority by so publicly and vehemently criticising the Environmental Protection Authority's greenhouse gas emissions guidelines, leading to the eventual withdrawal by the EPA of those guidelines;
- (b) express its concern that the McGowan Government cares more about the interests of the fossil fuel industry than it does about exercising its duty of care to the people of Western Australia and ensuring a future for our children and grandchildren;
- (c) recognise that addressing climate change is the responsibility of all levels of Government and express profound disappointment with the McGowan Government for using the Federal Government's inaction as an excuse for failing to show leadership and take responsibility for reducing Western Australia's emissions;
- (d) call on the McGowan Government to fast-track its development of a state climate change policy to ensure that Western Australia has a comprehensive and strategic plan to reduce our emissions and contribute to the global effort to address climate change; and
- (e) call on the McGowan Government to do everything in its power, including allocating appropriate resources, to ensure that the EPA can conduct a consultation process to the satisfaction of the Government and work towards re-introducing greenhouse gas emissions guidelines as soon as practicable.
