4135. Mr P. Papalia to the Minister for Corrective Services:

I refer to page 75 of the Inspector of Custodial Services Report of an Announced Inspection of Bandyup Women's Prison, note to paragraph 7.43, and I note that of the 864 women released from Bandyup in 2013, only 406 of them were sentenced. I understand the remaining 458 women were unsentenced and I ask:

- (a) Why were these 458 women taken into custody instead of being accommodated on bail? (Please specify the number of women for each reason);
- (b) How many of these unsentenced women:
 - (i) were released on bail (and subsequently did not receive a sentence);
 - (ii) received a non-custodial sentence (e.g. a fine or community work order);

- (iii) had charges against them withdrawn;
- (iv) were found not guilty; and
- (v) were released for any reason not given above:
 - (A) if any, what are those reasons;
- (c) How many of these unsentenced women:
 - (i) were Aboriginal; and
 - (ii) were from non-English speaking backgrounds;
- (d) How many women were released from Bandyup Women's Prison in 2014? Of these, how many were:
 - (i) sentenced; and
 - (ii) unsentenced;
- (e) Of the unsentenced women released from Bandyup Women's Prison in 2014, how many:
 - (i) were released on bail (and subsequently did not receive a sentence);
 - (ii) received a non-custodial sentence (e.g. a fine or community work order);
 - (iii) had charges against them withdrawn;
 - (iv) were found not guilty; and
 - (v) were released for any reason not give above:
 - (A) if any, what are those reasons; and
- (f) How many of these unsentenced women released from Bandyup Women's Prison in 2014:
 - (i) were Aboriginal; and
 - (ii) were from non-English speaking backgrounds?

 - (i) how many of these women were pregnant on their reception at Bandyup Women's Prison;
 - (ii) how many of these women were sentenced prisoners; and
 - (iii) were any of these women shackled during transportation? If so, how many and what was their security classification;
- (c) how many women have been taken out of Bandyup Women's Prison and transported to hospital for emergency treatment not related to pregnancy:
 - (i) how many of these women were sentenced prisoners; and
 - (ii) were any of these women shackled during transportation? If so, how many and what was their security classification;

- (d) how many complaints (via ACCESS) have been made by prisoners at Bandyup Women's Prison about officers' conduct;
- (e) how many officers at Bandyup Women's Prison have been suspended due to disciplinary action;
- (f) what are the reasons for this disciplinary action:
 - (i) have these officers returned to work or are due to return to work at Bandyup Women's Prison; and
 - (ii) has the Minister for Corrective Services been informed of any suspensions; and
- (g) how many officers at Bandyup Women's Prison have been dismissed due to misconduct:
 - (i) what was the nature of the misconduct; and
 - (ii) has the Minister for Corrective Services been informed of any dismissals?
