Point of Order

Hon Jon Ford raised the following Point of Order —

Mr President, the Minister keeps on referring to some restriction that some Act has on her delivering some information to the Parliament, and she implies some criminality. I seek your ruling on what has primacy: the Parliament and privilege, or the Act that the Minister refers to. I make the point so that I can understand that there is validity in her argument.

President's Ruling

The President ruled as follows —

Members, it is a very pertinent point of order in terms of the debates over a couple of pieces of legislation with which this chamber has been involved in recent months. The Minister can choose to answer the question in whichever way she likes. She is not bound by the criminality aspects of it if she chooses to answer questions in Parliament containing information, because Parliament provides the Minister and any other Member with that privilege within the parliamentary precincts. If a Member is absolutely determined to obtain that information, it would have to be done via a motion in this House to require the Minister to provide that information to Parliament.

Point of Order

Deputy Chair, we may save some time if you can answer my question for me. I ask whether, in your view, proposed new clauses 9A and 9B in Supplementary Notice Paper No. 298, Issue No. 2 are within the scope of the bill.

Deputy Chair's Ruling

The Deputy Chair ruled as follows —

Standing Order 134 allows amendments to be moved if they are within the subject matter of the Bill. Schedule 3 of the Standing Orders defines "subject matter" to mean "the provisions of the Bill as printed, read a second time and referred to the Committee of the Whole House". The provisions of the Bill before us are to secure adequate ongoing funds for the State to rehabilitate land affected by mining operations when the original operator does not fulfil its mine rehabilitation requirements. It is therefore narrow in scope and any amendment must be relevant to that purpose. The proposed amendment would introduce a new policy of creating an offence for not complying with the requirements of a relevant mine closure plan established under the Mining Act 1978 that is not contemplated within the scope of the Bill. I therefore rule the amendments out of order.

- (2) The Minister must prepare a report based on the review and must cause the report to be laid before each House of Parliament as soon as is practicable after it is prepared and, in any event, not later than 18 months after the end of the period referred to in subsection (1).
