8. Speaker's Statement – Matter of Public Interest

The Speaker advised members that Standing Order 145 relating to a Matter of Public Interest had been considered by successive Speakers to be much more limited than motions which are listed on the Notice Paper. As the notice period for a Matter of Public Interest was very short and debate time was limited, it was important not only to identify very specifically the issue targeted by the Matter of Public Interest, but also that it was confined to one matter, not a broad range of different matters. The motion currently proposed tested the boundaries of what should be allowed as a Matter of Public Interest. On this occasion, the Speaker advised that he was prepared to allow this motion to proceed. However, in future, a Matter of Public Interest needed to be drafted in a more confined manner.

9. Matter of Public Interest – Management of Government

The Speaker informed the Assembly that he was in receipt of a notice from Mr M. McGowan that he intended to move a motion on a matter of public interest.

At least five members having risen in support,

Mr M. McGowan moved,

That this House condemns the Barnett Government for its chaotic, dysfunctional and dishonest management of Western Australia specifically:

- the loss of the State's AAA credit rating;
- attacks on education;
- failures to plan for the State's health needs;
- failures in the energy portfolio; and
- failures in community safety.
