1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 11.00am pursuant to order.

The President, Hon Barry House, took the Chair and read prayers.

2. Petition

Hon Adele Farina presented a petition from 530 petitioners requesting the Legislative Council oppose the introduction of new recreational fishing licences and fees, and an increase in existing fees. (Tabled paper 1450).

3. Ministerial Statement - Legislative Council Parliamentary Sitting Dates

The Leader of the House made a Ministerial Statement with respect to the Government's intention to sit an additional week from 24 to 26 November 2009 to complete its legislative program.

10. Joint Authority Southern Demersal Gillnet and Demersal Longline Managed Fishery Management Plan Amendment (No. 2) 2009 - Disallowance

Hon Robin Chapple: To move on the next day of sitting -

That the *Joint Authority Southern Demersal Gillnet and Demersal Longline Managed Fishery Management Plan Amendment (No. 2) 2009* published in the *Gazette* on 11 August 2009 and tabled in the Legislative Council on 20 August 2009 under the *Fish Resources Management Act 1994*, be and is hereby disallowed.

11. Kimberley Liquefied Natural Gas Precinct

Motion No. 1 having been called, debate resumed on the motion of Hon Jon Ford as follows -

- (1) That this House expresses its concern at the comments made by the Premier to the Committee for Economic Development Australia Conference on Tuesday, 3 March 2009 in which he referred to a proposed LNG precinct to the north of Broome and stated -
 - "...we are proceeding in developing an LNG precinct to the north of Broome. That's not the spectacular part of the Kimberley coast, it's flat tableland, no people living within probably 30 or 40 kilometres of the area.That's important, we're trying to do that by negotiation, the timetable is the end of

this month. If we can't do it by negotiation, the State will resume the land. I'll do that reluctantly, but we will do it. We will not hold up economic development and we will not deny the people of the Kimberley – and particularly the Aboriginal people – the opportunity from some economic independence and some economic security."

- (2) This House calls on the Premier to -
 - (a) explain how he can claim to be negotiating in good faith when he put on public record that if he doesn't get a negotiated outcome he will resume the land to develop an LNG precinct to the north of Broome; and
 - (b) explain why he is presenting a veiled threat to indigenous people in respect of this matter and whether this is a sign of things to come.
