# 6. Metropolitan Region Scheme Amendment No. 1239/41 — Gidgegannup Urban Precinct — Disallowance

# 7. Road Traffic (Charges and Fees) Amendment Regulations (No. 6) 2014 — Disallowance

# 8. Climate Change

Motion No. 1 having been called, debate resumed on the motion of Hon Lynn MacLaren as follows — That this Council calls on the State Government to —

- (a) note that on May 9, the daily mean concentration of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere surpassed 400 parts per million for the first time since measurements began in 1958;
- (b) note that evidence of warming Western Australian oceans is indicated by the increased numbers of jellyfish, tropical fish and whale sharks observed further south than ever before; and
- (c) explain the changes required to the State Government's climate change strategy to reduce the rate of carbon dioxide emissions and to protect Western Australia's unique biodiversity.

The Minister for Mental Health moved, without notice —

To delete paragraph (c) and insert —

(c) continue its work on direct action measures and implementing its high level strategic framework to support agencies developing responses to adapt to the effects of climate change, recognising that decisions on the design, implementation and timing of the regulation of greenhouse emissions are primarily matters for the Commonwealth Government and Federal Parliament.
