  - (c) banning foreign donations.
- (2) That this House further calls on the Government to work through the COAG processes to ensure that financial disclosures to both federal and state bodies uniformly reflect the highest standards of transparency.

    - (i) matters directly relevant to clauses in the Bill that amend the *Surrogacy*Act 2009 and Human Reproductive Technology Act 1991 to address inconsistency with the Sex Discrimination Act 1984 (Cth); and
    - (ii) the proposed amendments contained in Supplementary Notice Paper No. 88 Issue No. 1.
