1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 10.00am pursuant to order.

The President, Hon Barry House, took the Chair and read prayers.

2. Petition

Hon Robin Chapple presented a petition from 701 petitioners requesting the Legislative Council to recommend that the Government establish an independent and timely public inquiry into the death in police custody of Ms Dhu. (Tabled Paper 2599).

5. Vocational-based Training

Non-Government Business No. 1 having been called, Hon Stephen Dawson moved, without notice — That this House condemns the Barnett Government for continuing to undermine vocational-based training by imposing further fee increases, cutting staff and reducing funding to the sector.

6. Bushfire Management

Private Members' Business No. 1 having been called, Hon Paul Brown moved, without notice — That this House discuss the strategies for bushfire management and hazard reduction in Western Australia.

Hon Paul Brown sought leave to table a document.

Ruling by Deputy President

The Deputy President made the following Ruling —

Hon Paul Brown seeks leave to table this document, and I use the word "document" loosely, because it is actually a placard, not a document. I want to remind Members that it has been the practice of the House to refuse leave to permanently table a document of this nature. There is a practical aspect to this practice, in that the Legislative Council table office must retain the tabled document permanently in the archives of the House. Unusual objects have been tabled in the past, but only for the remainder of the sitting day, for the information of Members, and only when an alternative means of providing this information is not available and not appropriate. In the past, the House has acceded to the tabling, for the remainder of the sitting day, of a stuffed quoll, and it has denied leave for a Member to table a fax machine with a document stuck in it. I suggest to the Member that there is an alternative to tabling such a large document, and that is for a photograph of the placard to be taken, printed on an A4 sheet of paper, and then tabled as a photo of the placard. The Member may find that in those circumstances, a grant of leave is more likely to be given.

Leave denied.

Debate ensued.

- (2) should it recommend that a general Demise of the Crown Statute be adopted, the Committee include in a Schedule to its report a Draft Bill for this purpose; and
- (3) report to the House on or before 14 May 2015.
