

## **NON-GOVERNMENT BUSINESS**

#### 1. Hardship Utility Grants Scheme — Increased Household Stress

Hon Colin Tincknell to move —

That the McGowan Government's tightening of the Hardship Utility Grants Scheme (HUGS) has removed an essential form of government assistance offered to families already struggling to meet every day living costs. The Labor Government has increased utility charges for gas, water and electricity and these increases, together with the limiting of HUGS has caused unnecessary financial stress to Western Australian households and their families.
