1. Meeting of Assembly

16. Misuse of Drugs Amendment (Psychoactive Substances) Bill 2015

Message No. 106 dated 15 October 2015 from the Legislative Council was reported agreeing to the bill without amendment.

17. Community Development and Justice Standing Committee – Extension of Reporting Date

The Speaker advised the House that he had received a letter from the Chair of the Community Development and Justice Standing Committee advising that the Committee had resolved to extend its reporting date to the House for its inquiry into the methods employed by WA Police to evaluate performance to 7 April 2016.
