1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 2.00pm pursuant to order.

The President, Hon Kate Doust, took the Chair and read prayers.

2. Statement by President — Parliamentary Education Office Video — The Difference between Parliament and Government

The President made the following Statement —

On your desks you would have received a small flyer and a packet of jelly beans with a QR code on the back. The QR code links to a web animation that explains the difference between Parliament and Government. The animation was produced by digital media students from North Metropolitan TAFE in partnership with the Parliamentary Education Office. This new tool for school, which is available on our website, is aimed primarily at school students to engage them in learning about Parliament in a way that is fun and appealing. It is a not-so-serious take on the serious work that we do. This project is one of the many ways that Parliament is seeking to identify alternative ways to engage with the community and promote the important work of Parliament. I encourage all Members to check it out and promote it to schools within their electorate. I offer my congratulations to the Parliamentary Education Office and the students who were involved in developing the animation.
