1. Meeting of Council

The President, Hon Barry House, took the Chair and read prayers.

9. Mental Health

Non-Government Business No. 1 having been called, Hon Stephen Dawson moved, without notice — That this Council condemns the Barnett Government regarding the state of mental health in Western Australia and calls on the Minister for Mental Health to explain the lack of progress on the Mental Health Bill and the implementation of the Stokes Report recommendations.

Debate ensued.

Point of Order

Hon Nick Goiran raised the following Point of Order —

Mr President, I just draw to your attention Standing Order 41, which refers to an allusion to debate in the Assembly. It reads as follows —

A Member shall not allude to any debate of the current calendar year in the Assembly, or to any measure impending therein.

I draw to your attention the motion moved by Hon Stephen Dawson and in particular the second aspect of the motion, which calls on the Minister for Mental Health to explain the lack of progress on the *Mental Health Bill*. The honourable Member referred to that Bill again just moments ago and my submission to you is that that is plainly a measure that is pending before the Assembly and it is inappropriate for this Member to move that aspect of the motion.

Just to make it crystal clear to anyone who has a difficulty with this point of order, I am not suggesting that the Member cannot move an aspect of this motion, but I am objecting to the reference to the suggestion that the Minister in this place ought to explain the lack of progress of a Bill that is not in this Chamber but in the other place.

President's Ruling

The President ruled as follows —

Members, there is no point of order in the sense that we are not talking about a debate on this Bill in the other place. We are talking about the general progress of legislation in a certain area and this area is the *Mental Health Bill*, which has certainly been mentioned in this place many times over the past few years. I hope that is clear. We cannot allude to the actual debate on that Bill in the Assembly, but I will allow the motion to stand as it is and a debate to occur on the general introduction and progress of legislation to cover this area.

Debate resumed.

Motion lapsed.

- make consequential and other amendments to the *Duties Act 2008*, *Settlement Agents Act 1982*, *Taxation Administration Act 2003* and *Transfer of Land Act 1893*,

and for related purposes." be introduced and read a first time.

Question — put and passed.

Bill read a first time.

The Attorney General on behalf of the Minister for Agriculture and Food representing the Minister for Lands moved, That the Bill be read a second time.

The Attorney General on behalf of the Minister for Agriculture and Food representing the Minister for Lands tabled an Explanatory Memorandum relating to the Bill. (Tabled Paper 1111).

Debate stands adjourned and the Bill referred to the Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review [SO 126].
