1. Psychiatric Hospitals — Patient Protection (*Notice given 11 June 2013*)

Resumption of debate adjourned (Wednesday, 18 June 2014), on the amendment of the Minister for Mental Health as follows –

To delete “calls on the Government to take urgent action” and insert —

notes the action being taken by the Government

to the motion of Hon Sally Talbot as follows –

That this House notes the findings of the Victorian Mental Illness Awareness Council, that 45 per cent of women who are inpatients in psychiatric hospitals in that state are sexually assaulted while an inpatient, and calls on the Government to take urgent action to —

- (a) establish the extent of similar problems in Western Australian psychiatric hospitals; and
- (b) protect women in Western Australian psychiatric hospitals from sexual assault.

2. Climate Change (*Notice given 18 June 2013*)

Hon Lynn MacLaren: To move –

- (a) note that on May 9, the daily mean concentration of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere surpassed 400 parts per million for the first time since measurements began in 1958;
- (b) note that evidence of warming Western Australian oceans is indicated by the increased numbers of jellyfish, tropical fish and whale sharks observed further south than ever before; and
- (c) explain the changes required to the State Government’s climate change strategy to reduce the rate of carbon dioxide emissions and to protect Western Australia’s unique biodiversity.
