16. President's Ruling — Marriage Equality Bill 2012

The President ruled as follows —

Members, yesterday during Non-Government Members' Business Hon Lynn MacLaren introduced the Marriage Equality Bill 2012. The Bill was read a first time and Hon Lynn MacLaren has moved that the Bill be read a second time.

Hon Nick Goiran has raised a point of order requesting that I rule that the Bill is invalid on the grounds of inconsistency with Commonwealth legislation pursuant to section 109 of the Commonwealth Constitution. I have also received from Hon Nick Goiran a written submission in support of his point of order.

I note that there has been a division of opinion amongst prominent legal academics throughout Australia as to the constitutional validity of legislation introduced in State Parliaments dealing with the issue of same-sex marriages. This division of opinion was highlighted in the national media only a few months ago when a bill in similar terms to the Marriage Equality Bill 2012 was introduced and dealt with by the Tasmanian Parliament. The key issue appears to be not whether a State Parliament has the legislative jurisdiction to enact such a law, but whether such a law could be effectively administered due to inconsistency with Commonwealth legislation.

The expression of a legal opinion as to the possible ultimate legal validity of a Bill once enacted has always been an acceptable matter for debate during the second and third reading debates on a bill, and may form the basis of a Member's vote at each of those stages. It is not, however, appropriate for me to make a ruling on such a matter of law.

It has been the traditional approach of Presidents of this House that such general matters of law are to be left to the courts to adjudge, and that the President should only make rulings on a matter of law that is directly related to the jurisdiction or procedures of the House; a common example being the applicability of section 46 of the *Constitution Acts Amendment Act 1899* to a Bill then under consideration by the House. The most recent rulings where such an approach has been taken were in relation to the various electoral reform bills of 2001, which were ultimately the subject of a series of court decisions once enacted.

I am therefore not prepared to rule the Bill out of order

The President tabled the submission on the point of order in relation to the *Marriage Equality Bill 2012*, from Hon Nick Goiran. (Tabled Paper 5446).

17. Statement by President — Standing Committee on Estimates and Financial Operations — Report No. 37 — Report in relation to a possible contempt regarding summonses to produce documents issued pursuant to Section 5 of the Parliamentary Privileges Act 1891

The President made the following Statement —

Members, you will be aware that the Standing Committee on Estimates and Financial Operations' thirty-seventh report was referred to the Standing Committee on Procedure and Privileges on Wednesday. I inform Members that the Procedure and Privileges Committee met three times yesterday and today in an attempt to resolve this matter before the Legislative Council rises tonight for the last time this year. Regrettably, we have not been able to conclude our inquiry and report in the very restricted time frame.

As an accusation of contempt of Parliament is a very serious matter, we tried to conclude our report to table it tonight, because I consider it unfair to have an accusation of contempt against any party unresolved for any extended period. Although the Procedure and Privileges Committee will continue its endeavours to complete the inquiry and report as soon as possible, we all know that the certainty of prorogation at some stage soon will prevent the Committee completing its work if we have not been able to report by then. Accordingly, at this last opportunity to make some information public through the Parliament while it is in session, I table a letter and attachments received this morning from Clayton Utz lawyers, which represent Health Solutions (WA), and inform members that I have referred this to the Procedure and Privileges Committee for its consideration in the inquiry.

The President tabled correspondence between the President, the Clerk of the Legislative Council and Clayton Utz in relation to a possible contempt regarding summonses to produce documents issued pursuant to section 5 of the *Parliamentary Privileges Act 1891*. (Tabled Paper 5447).
