2. Education and Health Standing Committee – Terms of Reference

The Deputy Speaker advised members that the Speaker had received a letter dated 12 March 2008 from Mr T.G. Stephens, MLA, Chairman of the Education and Health Standing Committee, advising that under Standing Order 255(1), the Committee had determined for itself terms of reference in relation to an inquiry into General Health Screening of Children at Pre-Primary and Primary School Level.

Dear Mr Speaker,

Pursuant to Standing Order 255 (1), I advise that the Education and Health Standing Committee resolved on Wednesday, 12 March 2008, to conduct an inquiry into the General Health Screening of Children at Pre-Primary and Primary School Level. The Committee also resolved that the inquiry be conducted within the following terms of reference:

- 1. Appraisal of the adequacy and availability of screening processes for hearing, vision, speech, motor-skill difficulties and general health.
- 2. An assessment of access to appropriate services that address issues identified by an appropriate screening process.

The Committee will report to the House by 9 September 2008.

Walker presented a petition from 4,636 persons requesting that the State Government through its sport and recreation or other portfolios, liaise with the Subiaco City Council to ensure that the Council prioritizes the health, psychological benefits and wellbeing to the Subiaco ratepayers and surrounding communities over any financial benefit to the Council and offers all possible financial and other support to the City to maintain such a facility in the Subiaco environs (P. 292).
