1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 10.00am pursuant to order.

The President, Hon Barry House, took the Chair and read prayers.

2. Statement by President — Vietnam Veterans Day — Battle of Long Tan — Fiftieth Anniversary

The President made the following Statement —

Today is Vietnam Veterans' Day. The day also marks the fiftieth anniversary of the Battle of Long Tan, one of the most well known conflicts of the Vietnam War involving the ANZACs.

On 18 August 1966, 108 young men, 105 from D Company, 6th Royal Australian Regiment, and three from a New Zealand artillery team, resisted an attack of up to 2,500 North Vietnamese and Viet Cong troops. The battle was fought in the late afternoon in a rubber plantation called Long Tan, where the men withstood intense mortar and machine gun fire and a torrential monsoonal downpour. After three to four hours of intense fighting, troop reinforcements arrived from other Australian, New Zealand and American supporting units, and the battle ended in the early evening. Eighteen Australian soldiers were killed, including Corporal Peter Clements and Private Richard Aldersea from Western Australia, with a further 24 men wounded. There were 245 confirmed Viet Cong and North Vietnamese fatalities, with more than 1,000 wounded.

To commemorate this historic day and the valiant and selfless efforts of those who served their country, the Speaker and I have arranged for Parliament House to be illuminated in red tonight.

- (a) welcomes recent statements by the Prime Minister of Australia, Hon Malcolm Turnbull, that Western Australia is unfairly treated in the distribution of GST revenue and that he intends to address this issue by introducing a minimum percentage 'floor' level below which no State's GST can fall in the future;
- (b) calls on all Western Australian Senators and Members of the House of Representatives to support the introduction of the minimum percentage 'floor' level as soon as possible to enhance the best interests of our State; and
- (c) calls on the Federal Government and all State governments, immediately upon the introduction of the minimum percentage 'floor' level, to investigate through the COAG process how best to move from the current flawed GST distribution system to a population-based distribution system.

Debate ensued. *Motion lapsed*.

12. Order of Business
