2. Statement by President — National Model Occupational Health and Safety Legislation — Information Session

The President made the following Statement —

I wish to provide you with some information on an event that is occurring tomorrow. You would have received information that Mr Peter Rozen SC will be delivering an information session on adopting national model occupational health and safety legislation entitled “Lessons to be learned” tomorrow at midday in the Members’ lounge. The model work health and safety laws were adopted in the Commonwealth, Queensland, New South Wales, the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern Territory on 1 January 2012 and in South Australia and Tasmania on 1 January 2013. In February this year Safe Work Australia published its “Review of the Model Work Health and Safety Laws: Final Report”. This is the first national review of the model work health and safety laws since their development and implementation. In this information session for Members, Mr Rozen will reflect on the review and its recommendations.
