MOTIONS

1. Gender Pay Gap — Pay Equity Inquiry (*Notice given 11 June 2013*)

Continuation of introductory remarks Hon Alanna Clohesy — 33 mins (Wednesday, 9 April 2014) in moving the following motion –

That the Legislative Council notes that Western Australia continues to have the widest gender pay gap in Australia and calls on the Government to conduct a pay equity inquiry as a matter of urgency and use the recommendations of that inquiry to formulate a two-year strategy to close the gender pay gap in Western Australia.

Total time remaining on motion – 3 hrs 48 mins.

2. Psychiatric Hospitals — Patient Protection (*Notice given 11 June 2013*)

Hon Sally Talbot: To move –

That this House notes the findings of the Victorian Mental Illness Awareness Council, that 45 per cent of women who are inpatients in psychiatric hospitals in that state are sexually assaulted while an inpatient, and calls on the Government to take urgent action to —

- (a) establish the extent of similar problems in Western Australian psychiatric hospitals; and
- (b) protect women in Western Australian psychiatric hospitals from sexual assault.

3. Climate Change (*Notice given 18 June 2013*)

Hon Lynn MacLaren: To move –

That this Council calls on the State Government to —

- (a) note that on May 9, the daily mean concentration of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere surpassed 400 parts per million for the first time since measurements began in 1958;
- (b) note that evidence of warming Western Australian oceans is indicated by the increased numbers of jellyfish, tropical fish and whale sharks observed further south than ever before; and
- (c) explain the changes required to the State Government's climate change strategy to reduce the rate of carbon dioxide emissions and to protect Western Australia's unique biodiversity.

4. Western Australian Schools (*Notice given 19 June 2013*)

Hon Sue Ellery: To move –

That this Council expresses its concern at the lack of transparent planning for the announced changes across Western Australian schools in 2015.

5. Marine Parks in Western Australia (*Notice given 11 June 2013, re-ordered 27 February 2014*)

Hon Rick Mazza: To move –

That the Council —

- (a) supports a moratorium on any further marine parks in Western Australia, and an investigation into the access to and management of the current marine parks in Western Australia; and
- (b) supports the trial of seasonal and rotational opening of marine parks in Western Australia to allow licenced recreational fishers to fish in designated areas in marine parks in Western Australia.

6. DisabilityCare (*Notice given 19 June 2013*)

Hon Alanna Clohesy: To move –

That this Council condemns the Barnett Government for its lack of leadership in the area of Disability Services and calls on the Government to put people before politics and sign up to DisabilityCare.

7. Waterways — Environmental Degradation (*Notice given 19 June 2013*)

Hon Sally Talbot: To move –

That this Council condemns the Barnett Government for its failure to take effective action to protect Western Australia's rivers, estuaries and inlets from environmental degradation.

8. Indigenous Suicide (*Notice given 19 June 2013*)

Hon Stephen Dawson: To move –

That this Council —

- (a) condemns the Barnett Government for its failure to combat the rise in suicide rates amongst Western Australia's indigenous population; and
- (b) calls on the Ministers for Aboriginal Affairs and Mental Health to outline to the House the strategies they will use to tackle the State's suicide rates.

9. Review of the RSPCA (*Notice given 13 June 2013, re-ordered 27 February 2014*)

Hon Rick Mazza: To move –

That the Council supports an investigation into the operations of the RSPCA, including an examination of its government funding, objectives and use of its powers.

10. Crop Risk Mitigation Product *(Notice given 19 June 2013)*

Hon Darren West: To move –

That this Council calls on the Barnett Government to support the introduction of a Crop Risk Mitigation Product into Western Australia.

11. Homeswest — Maintenance *(Notice given 19 June 2013)*

Hon Samantha Rowe: To move –

That the Council calls on the Government to conduct an independent and transparent enquiry into the Department of Housing with reference to the response time for maintenance and repairs of Homeswest tenants.

12. Fiona Stanley Hospital *(Notice given 19 June 2013)*

Hon Amber-Jade Sanderson: To move –

That the Council condemns the Government for its mismanagement of the establishment of Fiona Stanley Hospital and calls on the Government to release all details of its dealings with Serco on the Fiona Stanley Hospital contract.

13. Indigenous Communities — Safe Drinking Water Supplies *(Notice given 19 June 2013)*

Hon Stephen Dawson: To move –

That this Council condemns the Barnett Government for its failure to provide safe drinking water supplies to all indigenous communities throughout the Mining and Pastoral Region.

14. Domestic Assault — Support Services *(Notice given 19 June 2013)*

Hon Alanna Clohesy: To move –

That this Council notes the significant increase of reported domestic and other assaults in our community and calls on the Barnett Government to immediately commit to boost funding to enable the expansion of support services for women and children seeking to leave abusive or violent relationships.

15. Container Deposit Scheme *(Notice given 19 June 2013)*

Hon Sally Talbot: To move –

That this Council condemns the Barnett Government for its failure to introduce a container deposit scheme in Western Australia.

16. Muresk Facility *(Notice given 19 June 2013)*

Hon Darren West: To move –

That this Council notes the failure of the Barnett Governments' policy in terms of developing the facility at Muresk as a 'Centre of Excellence' in regard to the provision of a tertiary agribusiness degree and the establishment of the Western Australian Mining Academy (WAMA).

17. Children's Hospital — Planning and Analysis *(Notice given 19 June 2013)*

Hon Amber-Jade Sanderson: To move –

That the Council calls on the Government to engage in thorough analysis and planning regarding the potential demands on the New Children's Hospital. Noting that with the significant population growth in Western Australia, it is incumbent on the Government to review current plans and estimates with a view to increasing bed capacity in the new hospital.

18. Public Transport for Perth in 2031 — Draft Plan (*Notice given 19 June 2013*)

Hon Ken Travers: To move –

- (1) That the Council notes that —
 - (a) the Liberal/National Government released in July 2011 a “Draft for Consultation” of their plan “Public Transport for Perth in 2031”;
 - (b) the draft plan proposed two transformational projects by 2020 —
 - (i) the fast-tracking of the Northern Suburbs Railway extension to Yanchep; and
 - (ii) construction of a Central Northern Corridor/Curtin/UWA Light Rail;
 - (c) the draft plan identified that the following infrastructure was required in the next five to ten years —
 - (i) a new rail station at Karnup (near Paganoni Road);
 - (ii) upgrades to Canning Bridge and Stirling Stations; and
 - (d) the draft plan proposed a number of on-road Bus Rapid Transit projects be built by 2020, commencing with a Bus Rapid Transit system between Ellenbrook and Bassendean and across to Morley.
- (2) That this Council calls on the Government to —
 - (a) explain why it has taken two years to release the final version of this plan;
 - (b) outline whether it is still committed to the projects and the timelines outlined in the draft plan; and
 - (c) provide detailed reasons, including passenger modelling, for any changes they have made to priority projects or their timing.

19. Review of the *Firearms Act 1973* (*Notice given 12 June 2013, re-ordered 27 February 2014*)

Hon Rick Mazza: To move –

That the Council supports an investigation and review of the Firearms Act 1973, with particular reference to interstate visitor temporary permits, pensioner discounts, classification of ammunition components and the length of time it takes to process applications.

20. Taxi Drivers — Probationary System (*Notice given 19 June 2013*)

Hon Ken Travers: To move –

That the Council calls on the Barnett Liberal Government to explain why it will have taken more than three years to introduce a demerit point and probationary system for taxi drivers.

21. Environment Portfolio (*Notice given 20 June 2013*)

Hon Simon O’Brien: To move –

That this House congratulates the Liberal–National Government on its excellent performance in the environment portfolio.

22. Great Southern Region (*Notice given 20 June 2013*)

Hon Colin Holt: To move –

That this Council commends the Liberal–National Government on recognising the importance of the Great Southern Region of Western Australia and applauds the work done by this Government to support the communities of that region.

23. Education Portfolio (*Notice given 20 June 2013*)

Hon Liz Behjat: To move –

That this Council congratulates the Liberal–National Government on its excellent performance in the education portfolio.

24. Royalties for Regions — Pilbara Cities (*Notice given 20 June 2013*)

Hon Jacqui Boydell: To move –

That this Council congratulates the Liberal–National alliance government on its investment through the Royalties for Regions program into the Pilbara Cities initiative, further developing the interests and opportunities for the people and communities of the Mining and Pastoral Region.

That this Council congratulates the Liberal–National alliance government on its acknowledgement and support of the Mining and Pastoral Region and recognises the contribution Royalties for Regions has made to creating better and safer communities in regional Western Australia.

Hon Alyssa Hayden: To move –

That this Council congratulates the Liberal–National Government on its ability to provide ongoing high quality services and care to the Western Australia community in the health portfolio.

35. Regional Development — South West Region (*Notice given 20 June 2013*)

Hon Colin Holt: To move –

That this Council commends the Liberal–National Government on delivering outstanding regional development outcomes in the South West Region of Western Australia.

36. Mental Health Portfolio (*Notice given 20 June 2013*)

That this Council condemns the Barnett Government for its continuing failure to protect Western Australia's remaining native forest from the effects of climate change and disease.

39. State Infrastructure Plan (*Notice given 25 June 2013*)

Hon Ken Travers: To move –

That this Council —

- (a) expresses its concern at the failure of the Liberal/National Government to develop a long term State Infrastructure Plan for Western Australia;
- (b) notes that the lack of long term planning can lead to poor investment decisions being made in the expenditure of scarce Government funds; and
- (c) therefore, we call upon the Government to immediately commence the development of a long term State Infrastructure plan and to ensure that its development involves —
 - (i) wide community consultation to identify priority infrastructure projects;
 - (ii) the inclusion of major infrastructure projects is based on a comprehensive assessment of their relative benefit to cost ratios; and
 - (iii) the plan is developed in an open and transparent process.

40. James Price Point — LNG Processing Plant (*Notice given 25 June 2013*)

Hon Stephen Dawson: To move –

That this Council —

- (a) condemns the Premier for his lack of leadership in securing an outcome in benefits for the indigenous communities in relation to the James Price Point LNG processing plant; and
- (b) calls on the Barnett Government to honour the agreement signed with the Goolarabooloo Jabbirr Jabbirr Traditional Owners to deliver the Kimberley Benefits package.

41. Apprentices and Trainees in Training (*Notice given 25 June 2013*)

Hon Alanna Clohesy: To move –

That this Council condemns the Barnett Government for its disregard for the future of young Western Australians and calls on the Government to commit to making substantial increases (beyond pre-Global Financial Crisis levels) in the number of apprentices and trainees in training, especially numbers in trades training.

42. Disability Justice Centres — Kiara and Caversham (*Notice given 25 June 2013*)

Hon Amber-Jade Sanderson: To move –

That this Council —

- (a) notes the significant community response to the proposed Disability Justice Centres in Kiara and Caversham, and the lack of consultation with the affected communities;
- (b) calls on the Minister for Disability Services to immediately stop the current process for placing these centres in those locations; and
- (c) instigate a genuine and thorough community consultation process, with the communities surrounding the proposed centres;
 - (i) the process should include a community reference group, consisting of (but not limited to) representatives of residents, representative of Lockridge SHS and Primary School, Corrective Services, Disability Services Commission, the Minister or her representative; and
 - (ii) any final decision should be made with consideration for the communities' concerns and within the guidelines already set for the locating of these centres.

43. Threatened Species Recovery Plans (*Notice given 25 June 2013*)

Hon Sally Talbot: To move –

That this Council condemns the Barnett Government for its failure to resource threatened species recovery plans.

44. Coastal Communities — Climate Change (*Notice given 26 June 2013*)

Hon Sally Talbot: To move –

That this Council condemns the Barnett Government for its failure to address climate change and sea level rise impacts on our coastal communities.

45. Environmental Offsets Register (*Notice given 26 June 2013*)

Hon Sally Talbot: To move –

That this Council condemns the Barnett Government for its failure to implement an environmental offsets register that takes effect from the Government's endorsement of its Offsets Policy released in September 2011.

46. Proposed New Football Stadium (*Notice given 27 June 2013*)
