By notice dated Wednesday 1 April 2015 you informed me of a vacancy in the North Metropolitan Region of the Legislative Council.

On Saturday 11 April 2015, I published the notices required by section 156C of the *Electoral Act 1907* in *The West Australian* and *The Australian*. Nominations for the vacancy closed at 12.00 noon on Tuesday 21 April 2015.

At the close of nominations, I had received two formal nominations from qualified persons. A re-count was then conducted in accordance with section 156D(4) of the *Electoral Act 1907*.

Following the re-count and in accordance with section 156D(8)(a) of the *Electoral Act 1907*, I declared Martin Pritchard to be elected as a Member of the Legislative Council to fill the vacancy in the North Metropolitan Region.

I am pleased to inform you of the election of Martin Pritchard, as required by section 156D(8)(b) of the *Electoral Act 1907*.

The newly elected Member, Mr Martin Brian Pritchard, made and subscribed the Oath of Allegiance before the President.

4. Statement by President — Sir John Kirwan's Bible

The President made the following Statement —

Just to complete the swearing-in ceremony, I bring to the House's attention that the Bible upon which Hon Martin Pritchard was sworn in today formerly belonged to Sir John Kirwan, who Members will know from his period as a Member of the Legislative Council for 38 years, from 1908 to 1946, the last almost 20 years as President. This Bible, which is in now in the collection of the Legislative Council, was given to Sir John upon his swearing-in as a Member of the first Commonwealth Parliament in 1901. Sir John was the federal Member for Kalgoorlie from 1901 to 1903. In an inscription by Sir John inside the Bible, dated January 1905, he notes —

This is one of the Bibles on which Members of the first Commonwealth Parliament were sworn in. Each member received one.

It is also worth noting that the title pages of the Bible contain personal signatures of prominent people in attendance at that inaugural swearing-in. Not least is that of the then Prince George, Duke of Cornwall and York, later King George V, who opened the first Commonwealth Parliament on 9 May 1901. Other signatures collected by Sir John include those of at least four future Prime Ministers, including Sir Edmund Barton and William Morris "Billy" Hughes; the first Speaker of the House of Representatives, Sir Frederick Holder; Senator for Western Australia and future defence minister during World War One, Hon Paddy Glynn; and several other prominent Members who held ministerial positions in the early years of Australian self-government.

The presence of this Bible, and the history it represents, in this ceremony today reminds us of the durability and importance of our parliamentary system of government, and renews the commitment we all share to its continuance as the centrepiece of our strong and successful democracy.
