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##### *Speaker's Statement – Matters of Public Interest*

At least five members having risen in support,

Mr M. McGowan moved,

That this House condemns the Barnett Government for its chaotic budget management and broken promises, and for hurting the people of Western Australia with its mismanagement of the solar rebate scheme, raising taxes and electricity prices, and increasing household charges.

Debate ensued.

The Speaker, having called Mr P. Papalia to order more than three times, suspended the member from the service of the Assembly for the remainder of the sitting.
