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MOTIONS

1. Roe Highway Stage 8 (*Notice given 24 November 2010*)

Continuation of remarks Hon Philip Gardiner – 43 mins (Wednesday, 28 March 2012) on the amendment of Minister for Mental Health representing the Minister for Environment as follows –

To delete all words after “heritage” and insert —

this Council calls upon the Barnett Government to continue the processes to assess the environmental impacts of Stage 8 of the Roe Highway development.

to the motion of Hon Lynn MacLaren as follows –

That, for the purposes of —

- (a) saving the Beeliar wetlands by preserving ecological linkages and a range of other key values including —
 - (i) regionally significant vegetation, which is becoming rare as a result of encroaching urbanisation;
 - (ii) habitat for a great many fauna species, especially internationally and nationally significant migratory birds, as well as seriously threatened species like the Carnaby's Cockatoo and the Graceful Sun Moth; and
 - (iii) residential amenity, recreation and education; and
- (b) protecting our unique Aboriginal heritage; and

- (c) redirecting funds into more sustainable transport solutions, such as an expanded rail freight system and a passenger light rail network,

this House calls upon the Barnett Government to abandon the proposed Stage 8 of the Roe Highway development, and to request the Western Australian Planning Commission to initiate an amendment to the Metropolitan Region Scheme in order to delete the current zoning for a road reserve over the area of the proposed Stage 8 of the Roe Highway development.

2. Uranium Mining - Environmental Management *(Notice given 24 February 2011)*

Hon Alison Xamon: To move -

That this House recommend that, should the Government proceed with its intention to licence uranium mining in Western Australia, it adopts the same minimum environmental management regulatory requirements for any future uranium mine in Western Australia as exists under Commonwealth and Northern Territory legislation for the operation of the Ranger uranium mine in the Northern Territory with regard to the disposal of radioactive tailings, including the requirements that -

- (a) the tailings are physically isolated from the environment for at least 10 000 years; and
- (b) any contaminants arising from the tailings do not result in any detrimental environmental impacts for at least 10 000 years.

3. Unconventional Gas Exploration and Mining - Moratorium *(Notice given 15 March 2011, amended 21 September 2011)*

Hon Alison Xamon: To move -

That this House demands that the Government place a moratorium on all unconventional gas exploration and mining in Western Australia until such time as it can be assured that such activities will -

- (1) Have no impact on local land users, including -
 - (a) no reduction of available agricultural land;
 - (b) no reduction in local groundwater levels;
 - (c) no saltwater contamination of groundwater;
 - (d) no chemical contamination of groundwater; and
 - (e) no uncontrolled methane leakage from drilled locations.
- (2) Be governed by Government regulations that ensure that -
 - (a) absolute transparency is provided to the public about which chemicals are used in all unconventional gas drilling and hydraulic fracturing ('fracking') activities;
 - (b) rigorous independent testing is conducted on all chemicals before they are used in unconventional gas exploration, drilling and fracking operations to ensure no adverse impacts on groundwater, human health and the environment; and
 - (c) that any liability for contamination of ground water, land or community assets be borne by the company conducting the operations rather than the State and people of Western Australia.

4. Select Committee into Blind Cords and other Similar Products Installed in Residential Premises - Establishment (*Notice given 23 March 2011*)

Hon Wendy Duncan: To move -

- (1) That a select committee of three members is appointed.
- (2) The committee is to inquire into and report on —
 - (a) what blind cords and other similar products are currently on sale in Western Australia and whether they are subject to any safety regulations or standards;
 - (b) testing already done (in Australia and world-wide) on the products sold in Western Australia and results of these tests on the safety of these products;
 - (c) instances of deaths to children caused by blinds cords and similar products in Western Australia and world-wide; and
 - (d) instances of deaths to children caused by the faulty workmanship of a tradesperson installing blind cords and other corded window products in Western Australia.
- (3) The committee is to make recommendations to the House, including the following —
 - (a) the best way to affect a ban on corded blinds and other similar products found to be unsafe in tests; and
 - (b) the best way to remove existing corded and unsafe products from residential premises and require appropriate restraining devices to be installed as an interim measure prior to removal.
- (4) The committee is to report to the House no later than 1 November 2011.

5. Redress WA - Payments (*Notice given 17 May 2011*)

Hon Sue Ellery: To move -

That this House agrees with the comments by Premier Barnett that the Government's decision to cut the maximum payment available to Redress WA applicants from \$80,000 to \$45,000 was "a bit too tough", notes the devastating effect this second betrayal has had on many of the applicants and calls on the Government to re-visit this decision.

6. Pilbara Cities - Development Strategy and Plan (*Notice given 17 May 2011*)

Hon Jon Ford: To move -

That the Legislative Council calls on the Minister for Regional Development and the Premier to explain to the people of Western Australia the strategy and plan to develop the Pilbara Cities policy including -

- (a) how water will be supplied and how much it will cost;
- (b) how power will be supplied and how much it will cost;
- (c) how many new schools will be built and how the staff will be housed;
- (d) how many new ancillary health providers are required and how they will be housed; and
- (e) what the Government will do to ensure there is adequate affordable housing.

7. State Suicide Prevention Strategy (*Notice given 17 May 2011*)

Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich: To move -

That this House condemns the Barnett Government for its failure to honour its election commitment to spend \$13 million in the first two years of government to develop a comprehensive WA State Suicide Prevention Strategy with a particular emphasis on young people, young men, Aboriginal people and people who live in rural and regional Western Australia, and calls on the Government to support a coronial investigation into the rate of suicide.

8. Universal Child Health Checks *(Notice given 24 May 2011)*

Hon Linda Savage: To move -

That this House calls on the Government to implement the recommendations of the Auditor General's Report 11 – November 2010 'Universal Child Health Checks'.

9. Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service - Funding *(Notice given 24 May 2011)*

Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich: To move -

That this House notes the findings from the Commissioner for Children and Young People in the inquiry into the mental health and wellbeing of children and young people in Western Australia, and calls on the Minister for Mental Health to immediately implement the recommendations by providing extra funding for the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service.

10. Public Housing - Financial Hardship for Western Australian Seniors *(Notice given 25 May 2011)*

Hon Sue Ellery: To move -

That this House notes that the decision of the Western Australian Government to end the moratorium on including increases in pension rates in its rental charges for public housing has created additional financial hardship for Western Australian seniors.

11. Mental Health Reforms *(Notice given 25 May 2011)*

Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich: To move -

That this House calls on the Minister for Mental Health to explain —

- (a) why the new Mental Health Act will not be introduced in Parliament until mid-2012; and
- (b) why the Barnett Government has failed to deliver reform in the area of Mental Health.

12. Mental Health Services *(Notice given 25 May 2011)*

Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich: To move -

That this House condemns the Barnett Government and the Minister for Mental Health for their cuts to Mental Health services and their failure to implement policy decisions.

13. Select Committee into the Prolonged Detention Without Conviction of Mr Marlon Noble - Establishment *(Notice given 22 September 2011)*

Hon Alison Xamon: To move -

- (1) That a select committee of five members is appointed.
- (2) The committee is to inquire into and report on —
 - (a) the circumstances surrounding the laying of the original charges against Mr Marlon Noble;
 - (b) the circumstances surrounding the making of the custody order against Mr Marlon Noble; and
 - (c) the Mentally Impaired Accused Review Board's handling of Mr Marlon Noble's case following the making of the custody order.
- (3) The committee is to report to the House no later than 1 December 2012.

14. Resources Boom - Access to Future Economic Benefits *(Notice given 19 October 2011)*

Hon Jon Ford: To move -

That this House condemns the Barnett Government for its lack of vision, investment and action in ensuring that Western Australia uses the resource boom to build its capacity to provide economic certainty for all citizens well beyond the boom years.

15. Uranium Mining Ban (*Notice given 22 November 2011*)

Hon Jon Ford: To move -

That this House condemns the Barnett Government's lifting of Western Australia's long standing ban on uranium mining, and asks the Government how it can ensure that Western Australians -

- (a) will not be encumbered with long term financial commitments to manage radioactive and heavy metal contaminated sites for over a thousand years of future generations;
- (b) interests can be protected with public sector advice that current approvals can be granted by accepting industry assertions that the environment will not be contaminated by mining waste over the next thousand years or more; and
- (c) that Occupational Safety and Health regulators and laws are now, and will in the future be, competent and adequate to ensure workers and their families are not endangered by this uranium industry?

16. Social Work Profession - Inclusion in National Registration and Accreditation Scheme (*Notice given 22 November 2011*)

Hon Alison Xamon: To move -

That this House calls on the Minister for Health to immediately take action to protect the health and wellbeing of the Australian public by working with other Australian Government, State and Territory Health Ministers to include the social work profession in the National Registration and Accreditation Scheme.

17. Planning for Children in Care (*Notice given 29 November 2011*)

Hon Sue Ellery: To move -

That this House notes the findings of the 'Planning for Children in Care: An Ombudsman's Own Motion Investigation into the administration of the care planning provisions of the *Children and Community Services Act 2004*' including widespread non-compliance with the Act and calls on the Minister for Child Protection to explain the discrepancy between that report and answers provided to the House.
