FIRST SESSION OF THE THIRTY-EIGHTH PARLIAMENT

WEDNESDAY, 26 MAY 2010

1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 12.00 noon pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

Prayers were read.

2. Petitions

Shack Site Communities – Mr M.J. Cowper presented a petition from 381 persons requesting that Shack Site communities be preserved so Western Australians have affordable coastal holiday destinations for future generations (P. 290).

Urban Development South of the Moore River – Ms L.L. Baker presented a petition from 19 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly support the recommendation that the land adjoining the proposed Wilbinga Conservation Park be protected from future development (P. 291).

3. Notice of Motion Lapsed

The Speaker advised that Private Members' Business Notice of Motion No. 9 had lapsed and, unless the member indicated otherwise, would be removed from the Notice Paper.

4. Brief Ministerial Statements

Brief Ministerial Statements were made by –

The Minister for Road Safety on a new road safety campaign to highlight the cost of road trauma.

The Minister for Education on the Australian Early Development Index: Building Better Learning Forum, opened on 13 May 2010.

The Minister for Housing on the Government's \$5 million commitment to rebuild and revitalise Roebourne.

The Minister Assisting the Treasurer, pursuant to notice, moved,

At least five members having risen in support,

Mr E.S. Ripper moved,

That this House condemns the Barnett Government's 2010-11 State Budget as an attack on family living standards through its massive increase in charges and fees especially for water.
