2. Statement by President — Mental Health Bill 2013 — Second Reading Speech

The President made the following Statement —

I would like to make an observation about the second reading speech on the *Mental Health Bill 2013*, given last night. The speech ran to some 21 pages and took around 60 minutes for the Minister for Mental Health to deliver. It was one of the longest second reading speeches I have experienced in my time in this Chamber, probably the longest. No-one in this place could question the quality and detail of the information contained in the speech, it was very thorough. However, the intent of a second reading speech should be to give Members a summary of the major initiatives contained in the Bill. The introduction in Standing Order 121(3) of the requirement for the Member in charge of a Bill to table an explanatory memorandum was intentionally designed to provide the clause-by-clause detail that Members need to assist them in an understanding of the policy and effect of a Bill. I would not like to see the length and detail of the speech given last night to become common practice. If this were to become the case, changes to Standing Orders may have to be contemplated.
