1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 2.00pm pursuant to Temporary Orders.

2. Statement by President — Deputy Clerk — Paul Grant — Appointment

The President made the following Statement —

It is with great pleasure that I announce my intention to formally recommend to Her Excellency, the Governor, the appointment of Mr Paul Antony Grant as Deputy Clerk of the Legislative Council. Paul has served as an officer of the Legislative Council for the past 16 years having been initially appointed as Advisory Officer to the Standing Committee on Estimates and Financial Operations in January 2000. Prior to commencing with the Legislative Council, Paul worked as a lawyer in private practice and for the Department of Fisheries.

Since January 2010 he has held the position of Clerk Assistant (Procedure) of the House. I thank the Deputy President, Hon Adele Farina, and our Clerk for being part of the interview panel.

12. Statement by President — Seventh Annual Heritage Open Day 2015

The President made the following Statement —

I wish to inform the House that Parliament House was open last Sunday, 18 October, for the seventh annual Perth Heritage Days, celebrating the people who shaped Perth. Parliament commemorated Edith Cowan and many of its members who have shaped this city and state. Both the Speaker and I attended, and we were extremely pleased as an estimated 633 people took the opportunity to explore Parliament House. Parliament came alive with life-size cut-outs of chanting suffragettes on the ground floor, regular performances and presentations in both chambers, as well as colourful displays in the Aboriginal People's Gallery, the Parliamentary Library and many of the corridors. To add to the atmosphere, many of the staff and performers who worked on the day also dressed in period costume.

The Parliament was supported on the day by the generous involvement of Heritage Perth itself; the Western Australian International Women's Day Collaboration, who spoke on women's firsts in Parliament; plus Edith Cowan University and the Peter Cowan Writers Centre, which were integral in compiling a display of Edith Cowan memorabilia displayed in the Aboriginal People's Gallery.

This event would not have been possible without the hard work, passion and commitment of parliamentary staff, particularly those from the Education and Community Engagement Unit. A number of staff willingly gave up their Sunday to act as tour guides, while a lot of work was completed prior to the event in developing the displays and coordinating the logistics. Congratulations and thank you to everyone who was involved. I extend appreciation to all those Members, former Members and staff who came along to support the event.

relevant area means the Mitchell Plateau area or that area modified to the extent necessary to reflect any changes to the boundaries of land contiguous to that area resulting from survey or cadastral information.

(2) Despite anything in the *Mining Act 1978*, a tenement application cannot be made in respect of land wholly or partly within the Mitchell Plateau area.
