1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 12 noon pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

2. Petitions

Genetically Modified Crops Free Areas Act 2003 – Ms M. Davies presented a petition from 132 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly call for an independent review of the *Genetically Modified Crops Free Areas Act 2003* by a parliamentary committee, and also that it supports GM-free farming and urges the Government to introduce farmer protection legislation to compensate farmers who suffer economic loss due to GM contamination (P. 283).

Bassendean Primary School Oval – Mr D.J. Kelly presented a petition from 1 person asking the Legislative Assembly to cease construction on the Bassendean Primary School car park, restore the oval, and work with staff, parents, students and the wider community to find a solution that preserves our play space (P. 284).

Perth Freight Link: Roe Highway Extension – Mr F.M. Logan presented a petition from 99 persons requesting the Legislative Assembly to call on the Barnett Government to reverse the decision to allow Roe 8 Highway (eastern end of the Perth Freight Link) to go ahead and to support requests by the residents of the City of Cockburn, the sons and daughters of the AWAS women and the RSL City of Cockburn Sub branch to preserve, and not destroy this site (P. 285).

10. Peel-Harvey Catchment Management Bill 2014

The Order of the Day for the resumption of the debate upon the second reading of the bill was read. Debate resumed.

Speaker's Statement – Bill requiring a Governor's Message

The Speaker advised members that the question before the House was that the bill be read a second time. However, the Speaker advised that the Peel-Harvey Catchment Management Bill 2014, if passed, would provide for the payment of moneys in certain circumstances.

Section 46(8) of the *Constitution Acts Amendment Act 1899* provides that a vote, resolution or bill for the appropriation of moneys shall not be passed unless the purpose of the appropriation has been recommended by message of the Governor to the Assembly.

The Speaker ruled that this bill requires a message and note that one has not been received. Therefore, in accordance with the practice of the House, the question for the second reading will not be finally put to the House unless a message is received. I direct that the bill go to the bottom of the Notice Paper until a message is received.
