THURSDAY, 15 OCTOBER 2009

1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 11.00am pursuant to order.

The President, Hon Barry House, took the Chair and read prayers.

2. Ministerial Statement - Wave Energy Project - Carnegie Corporation

The Minister for Environment made a Ministerial Statement with respect to the Low Emissions Energy Development Fund - Carnegie Corporation's Wave Energy Project.

Ordered - That consideration of the Ministerial Statement be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

5. Kimberley Liquefied Natural Gas Precinct

Motion No. 1 having been called, Hon Jon Ford continued his introductory remarks in moving the following motion -

(1) That this House expresses its concern at the comments made by the Premier to the Committee for Economic Development Australia Conference on Tuesday, 3 March 2009 in which he referred to a proposed LNG precinct to the north of Broome and stated -

"...we are proceeding in developing an LNG precinct to the north of Broome. That's not the spectacular part of the Kimberley coast, it's flat tableland, no people living within probably 30 or 40 kilometres of the area.That's important, we're trying to do that by negotiation, the timetable is

the end of this month. If we can't do it by negotiation, the State will resume the land. I'll do that reluctantly, but we will do it. We will not hold up economic development and we will not deny the people of the Kimberley – and particularly the Aboriginal people – the opportunity from some economic independence and some economic security."

- (2) This House calls on the Premier to -
 - (a) explain how he can claim to be negotiating in good faith when he put on public record that if he doesn't get a negotiated outcome he will resume the land to develop an LNG precinct to the north of Broome; and
 - (b) explain why he is presenting a veiled threat to indigenous people in respect of this matter and whether this is a sign of things to come.
